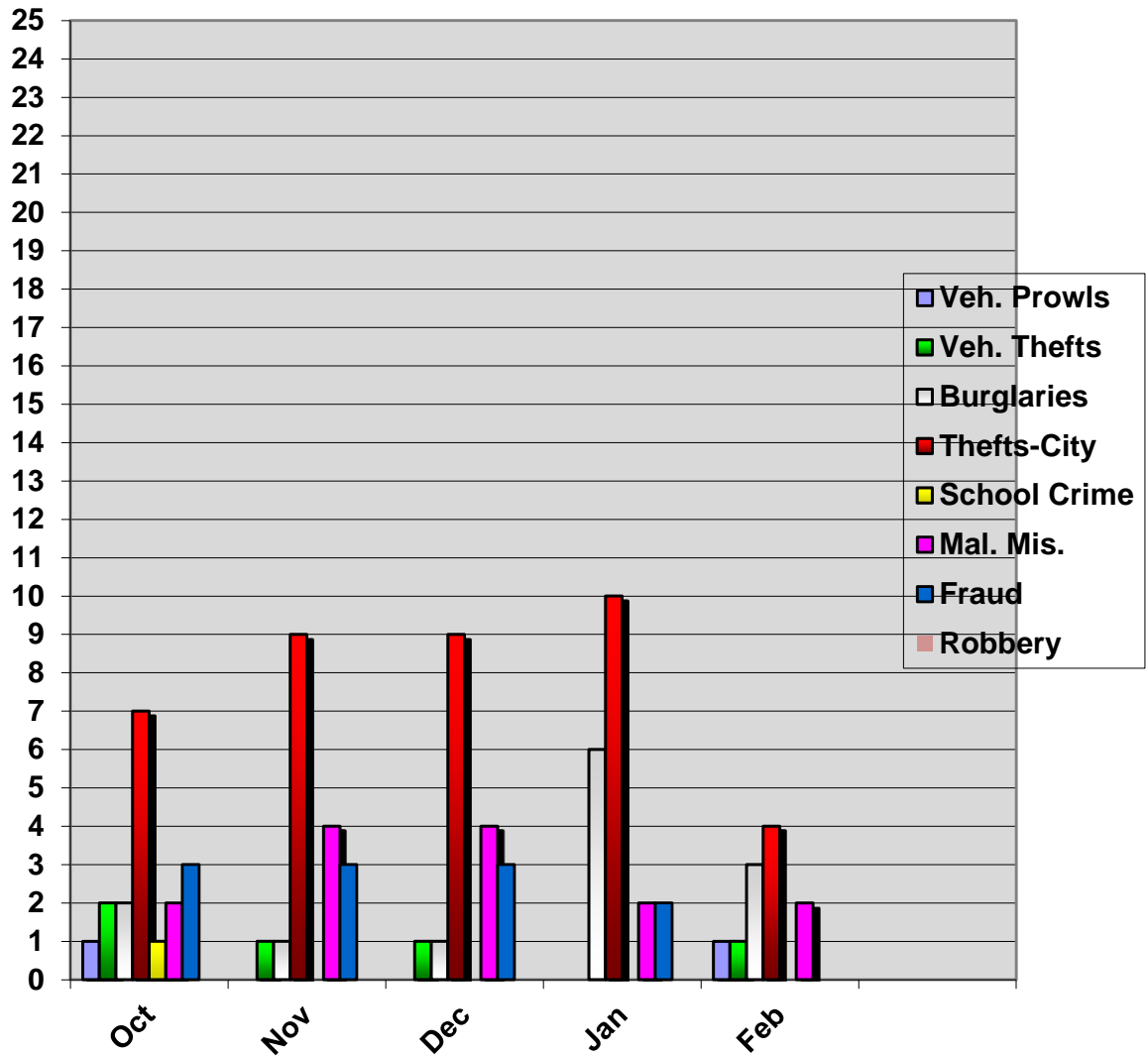

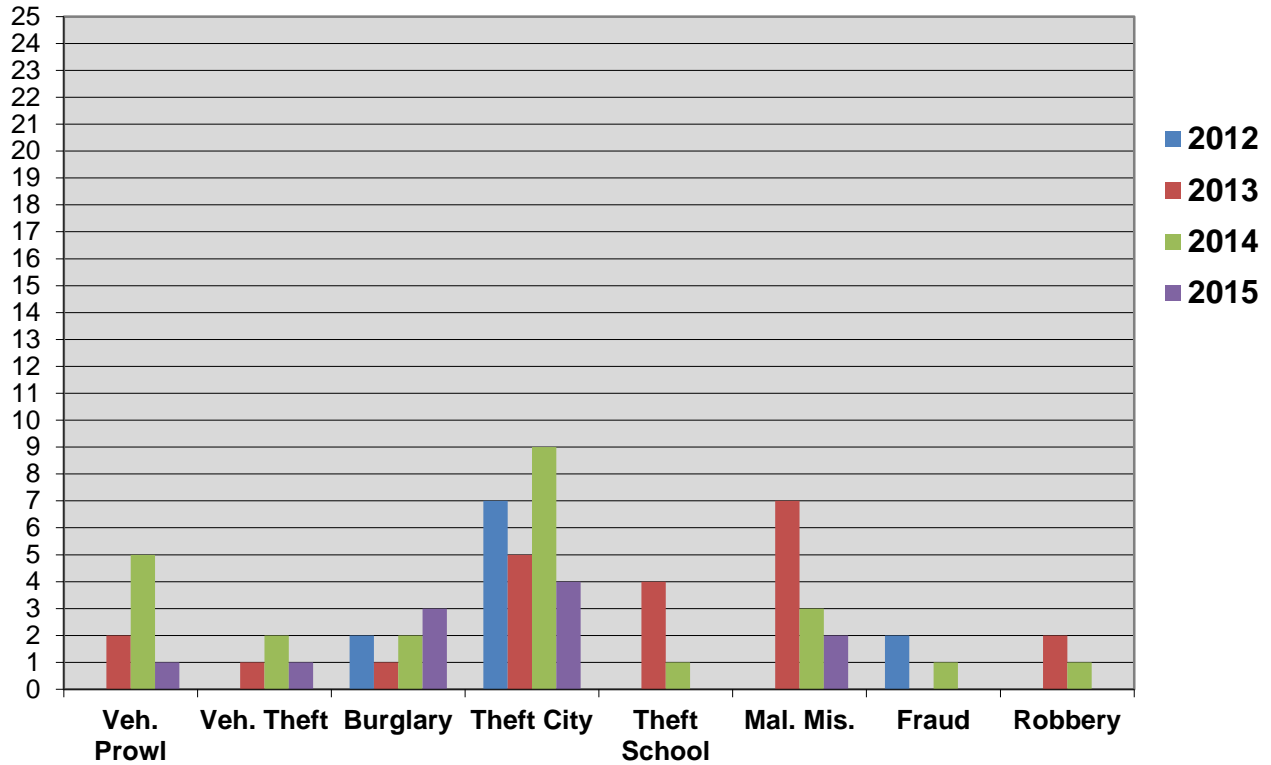
Detective Report – February 2015

During the month of February there was a burglary of Hamilton Lumber where over \$750.00 dollars of tools were stolen. Thanks to the quick response of Sgt Sanders and Deputy Chaney two individuals of interest were contacted and later arrested. The vehicle they were driving was seized and impounded pending a search warrant. I was called in to do an interview of the two. Although initially they did not confess to the crime I did obtain a written statement from both suspects. One of the suspects was booked on his Escape community custody warrant for Robbery. The other was released. Sgt Sanders applied for and was granted a search warrant for the vehicle where I assisted him in the collection of evidence. Deputy Willoth was also instrumental in assisting me in this case in the collection and booking of evidence. The tools stolen from Hamilton Lumber were located in the trunk of the vehicle searched and returned to the victim. I was given the case to complete and after contacting and re interviewing the individual who had been released, I was able to obtain a confession from him where he knowingly admitted being involved as the “Driver” in the burglary of Hamilton Lumber, implicating his passenger as the actual individual who committed the burglary. Both individuals are being charged in this case.
