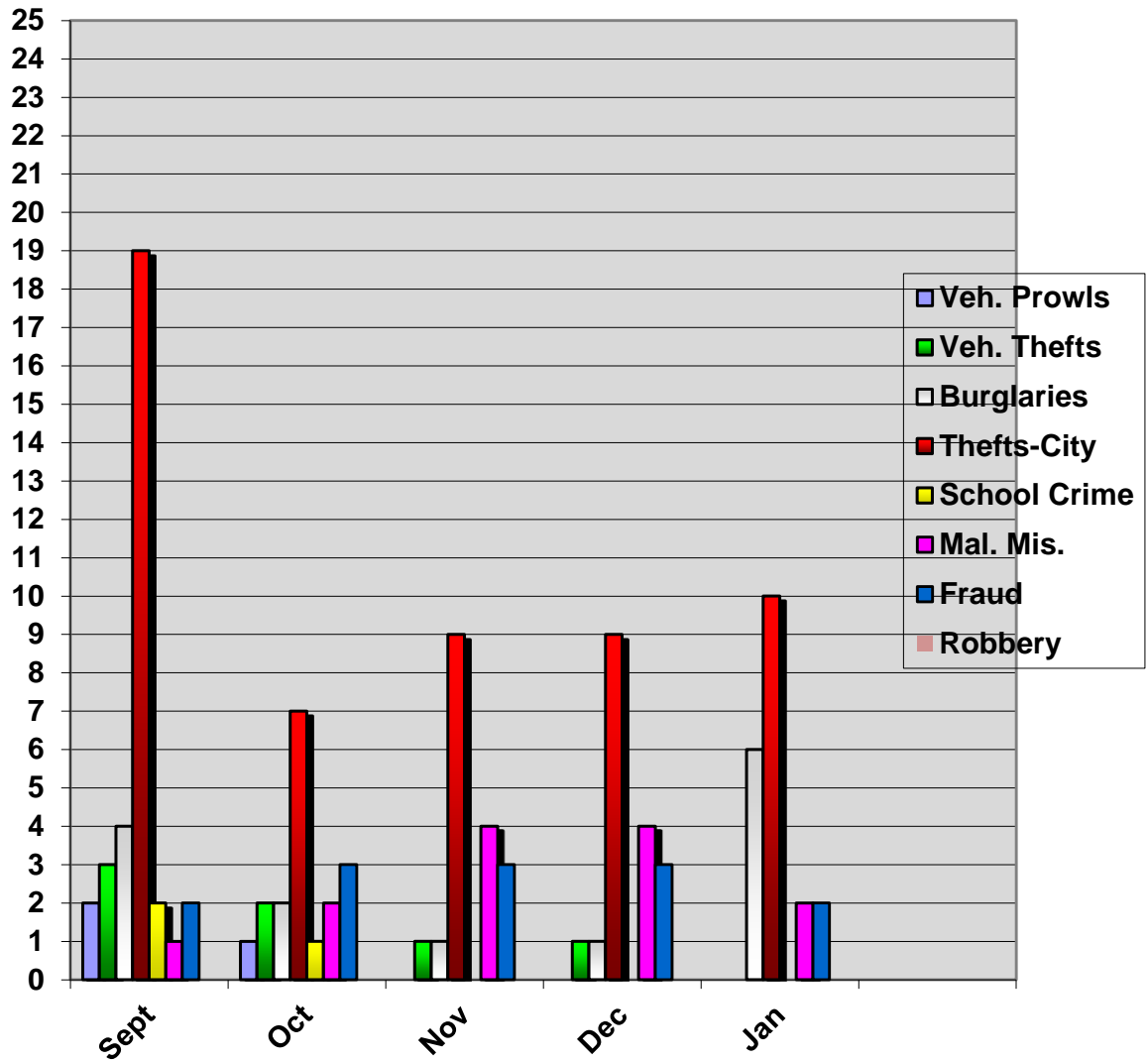

Detective Report – January 2015

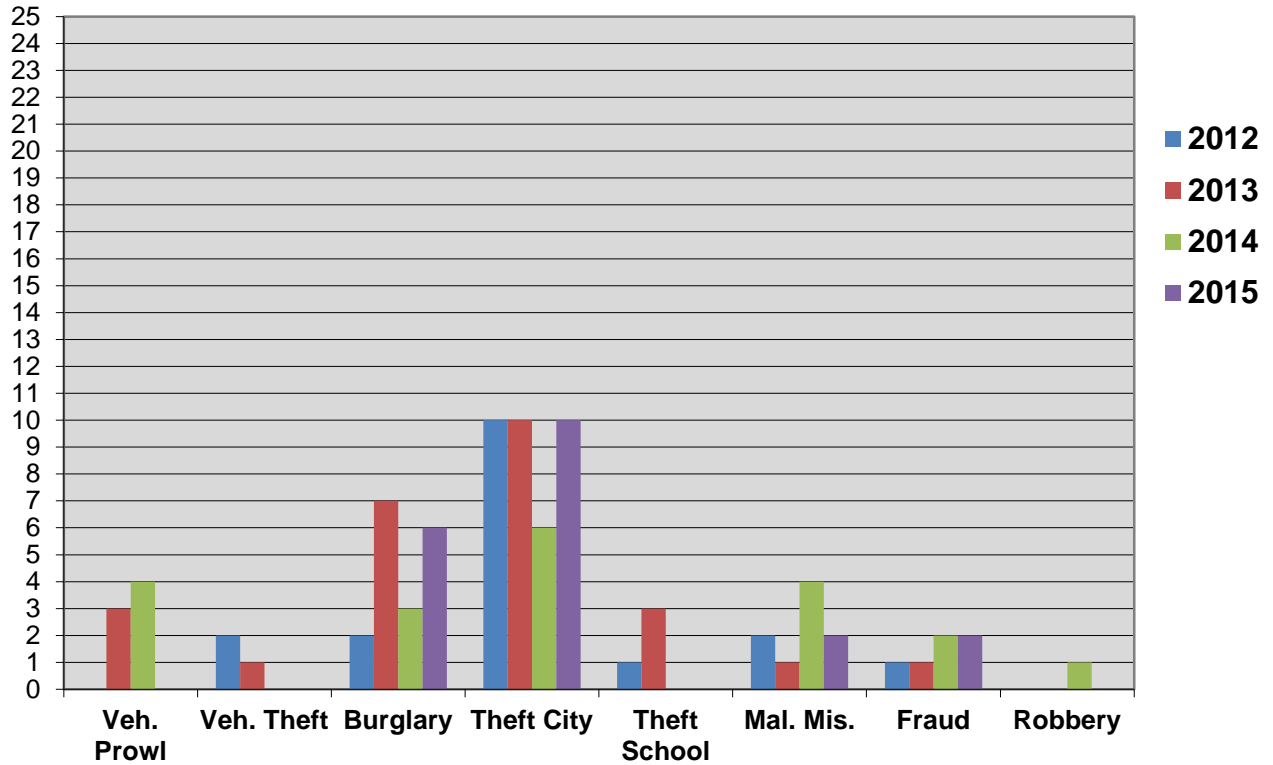
In the month of January there was a Burglary in which several musical instruments were taken from a house at the north end of 101st. The situation began with an elderly female who inherited the Stanwood home from her mother at the time she passed away. In turn she met a young man through the church who had convinced her he had fallen on hard times. She allowed this self-admitted recovering heroin addict to live in the house. In exchange her only request was he would provide some much needed yard work. Contained within the home was her musical instrument collection left over from a closed music business in the city, approx. 25,000 dollars' worth of musical instruments. The suspect in this case ends up not being a recovering heroin addict at all but an active user. Over the course of 6 months he systematically sold, pawned, or directed other individuals to pawn or sell a significant portion of her instrument collection. In addition to the instruments there was also a truck she sold to the suspect which he had been making payments on. This truck was recovered by the victim's husband after the suspect defaulted on the loan. The truck was recovered at the suspect's girlfriend's house. The suspect's girlfriend became angry at her boyfriend who had stolen several items from her and her mother while he was staying with them in Lynnwood. The girlfriend had knowledge the instruments were being pawned by her then boyfriend; in addition to her pawning one of them herself. She called the victim to let her know what was going on and told her the location of the truck. At the time the truck was recovered some of the pawn slips were located inside the vehicle which the suspect had possession of. These pawn slips which the victim turned over to me led me to being able to recover many of the pawned instruments, which had not all been pawned in the suspect's name. In the end several thousand dollars' worth of musical instruments were recovered from various pawn shops on the I-5 corridor between Stanwood and Shoreline. This case is being referred for several felony counts involving trafficking and theft.

While I was working the above case SHS was broken into over the long Martin Luther King day weekend. Five juveniles entered the school via an unsecured class room window, stealing several classroom computers. During the investigation it was determined the school had been entered on three separate occasions; Lincoln Hill, via the roof through the accessed door into the attic. About half an hour later Stanwood HS (0615hrs) through the window; then about an hour after that again between 715 to 730am hrs. The stolen items were taken to a well-known residence just west of the school. Thanks to the assistance of Deputy Jensen who was able to provide information on the identity of these persons involved. During questioning confessions were obtained and a large quantity of the items stolen from the school were recovered. The students involved were expelled pending the referral of numerous felony charges.
