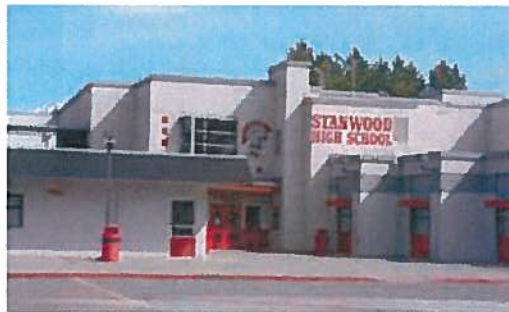

## Student Brings Gun to School

A Stanwood High School student brought a .22 caliber revolver and a fifty round box of ammunition to school in his backpack. Prior to the start of classes, the boy showed the gun to at least one other boy in a school bathroom. Sometime around the middle of the day, the boy was concerned that his backpack would be searched and convinced another male student to hold the gun and ammunition in his backpack. Rumors of the gun reached school staff and the School Resource Officer late in the day. The gun was not located when the suspect's backpack was searched. The suspect retrieved the gun and ammunition before riding the bus home after school. School staff had previously called the boy's mother and she advised that a gun was missing from the nightstand in a bedroom at the home. The boy's mother recovered the gun when her son arrived home on the bus. The suspect admitted to bringing the gun to school, because he planned on running away from home. During the investigation, several students were interviewed. Investigators learned that several students had seen the gun early in the school day and that multiple students had heard rumors about the gun, however, none of the students reported this to school staff until the school day was nearly over. Charges have been referred to the Prosecutor's Office for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

## Phone Scams

There has been an increase in phone scams in the last couple of months and several Stanwood area citizens have lost thousands of dollars. The most common scams involve victims being advised that they have a warrant for their arrest because they missed jury duty or that they will have their power shut off because they did not pay their last electric bill. All of the scams involve the victim being instructed to purchase a prepaid card of some type (example i-Tunes). The scammer requires this form of cash to prevent the victim's arrest or having their power shut off. The victim is then instructed to give the scammer the card number and PIN. The scammer gets the money and is virtually untraceable.



## Caught On Camera

Two juvenile males entered a fenced area at the Stanwood High School Agriculture Compound with intentions of stealing wood. Once inside the fenced area they proceeded to damage property, including breaking all the windows out of an old fire truck. Deputy Jensen investigated the incident and learned the school surveillance cameras recorded both males during the act. Deputy Jensen located and arrested both suspects. Both males were interviewed and they confessed to the crime. The school district estimated the damage to property at \$3000 to \$5000.

## Playground Equipment Stolen from Josephine

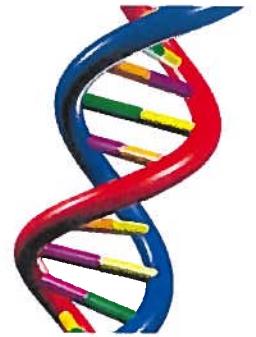

It is not known exactly when the theft occurred or what portions of the playground were actually taken. It is estimated that \$10,000 in materials are missing.

## Man Assaults Ex-Girlfriend During Burglary

On 11-17-16 at about 4:00pm a woman woke to her ex-boyfriend standing over her bed. The man unlawfully entered the home and sexually assaulted the woman, before leaving the house a short time later. Deputies responded, interviewed witnesses, photographed the scene and collected several pieces of evidence. The victim was examined at the Colby Campus of Providence Hospital. The suspect was arrested within hours of the assault and booked into the Snohomish County Jail on a burglary and sexual assault charge. The man is currently being held on \$250,000 bail. Potential DNA evidence will be submitted to the Washington State Patrol Lab for testing.



## Focus on Offenders

On 11-15-16 Stanwood Police received a citizen report that one of our targeted offenders was seen in the 7300 block of 284 ST NW. This offender was known to have an outstanding felony warrant for his arrest. Deputies responded to the area along with a Sheriff's Office K-9 unit. During a subsequent dog track, the offender was located and arrested on the warrant. The suspect was wearing a backpack and was linked to large bag found in a wooded area along the path he took while running from the police. A search warrant was obtained for the contents of the backpack and bag. Evidence of vehicle prowling and burglary was discovered, with several victims identified in the Lake Ketchum area. Charges of Possession of Stolen Property have been referred to the Prosecutor's Office. The investigation continues with the possibility of additional charges. The offender is currently being held in the Snohomish County Jail on \$100,000 bail.
