Bomb Threats

Port Susan Middle School had three separate bomb threats during the month. Two threats were written on scraps of paper that were located by students at Port Susan Middle School. The third threat was written on one of the bathroom stall walls. Each threat was non-specific in nature. The threats did not give a time, date, means, or specific location. The threats were turned in, but it was unknown how long the threats had been in the area they were found. The threat on the bathroom wall was known to students for at least a day before it was reported.

No evidence was found to identify any of the possible students that wrote the threats. The threats were not connected and appear to be from three separate persons.

The threat on the bathroom wall resulted in an evacuation of the school. This threat was specific to a bomb being attached to a door. By the time the threat was reported most of the doors in the school had been used multiple times. The school was evacuated to check other possible doors that had not been used. There were



no suspicious items located and the students were returned to class in about 15 minutes.

Other threats of violence were reported at LHHS and SHS. Students reported hearsay information concerning a student planning an attack on April 20th. This was investigated and found it involved the same information that has been investigated twice over the school year. No credible threat was found to exist.

MARIJUANA

AT SCHOOLS

There were incidents involving marijuana at the schools.



Lincoln Hill High School , Port Susan Middle School and Stanwood Middle School all had cases involving marijuana.

One student stated they obtained the marijuana from a high school student, one from

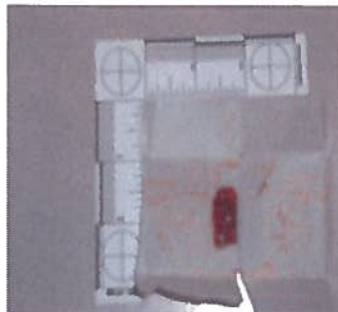
his brother and the final incident involved “dabs” from an unknown source.

The student with the “dabs” was found in possession of an electronic pipe with the accessories to smoke the “dabs”. “Dabs” is a particular problem and is growing in popularity with teenagers.

“Dabs” is THC that is stripped from the leaves and plant material from the marijuana plant.

The THC is more concentrated than smoking the plant material.

“Dabs” is odorless and can be easily concealed. There have only been a couple of incidents at the schools involving “dabs”, but students report and information from social media sites indicate a larger problem.



Special points of interest:

- ◆ Stanwood High School had their annual powder puff football game. The event was highly successful with the seniors taking the win.
- ◆ Stanwood High School held a black light dance after the football game which was enjoyed by many students.
- ◆ Utsalady elementary had an incident involving a guardian of a fifth grader having a mental health crisis. It was feared the person would come to the school and cause possible problems. The school was put into lockdown until Island County Sheriff was able to locate the individual and provide the assistance that was required.

Armed Robbery



At about 5:46am on 03-14-17 two armed subjects walked into the Stanwood AM/PM and forced a male customer to the floor, before demanding cash from the two female employees behind the counter. Both subjects were wearing hooded sweatshirts with masks. One subject was armed with a revolver and the other was carrying what looked like a semi-automatic rifle. One subject had the clerk place cash in a brown or green backpack with an orange interior, before he fled the store on foot. The second subject demanded cigarettes before he fled the store on foot a short time later. Both subjects ran around the back of the store and may have been seen walking northbound on 104 DR NW after the robbery. Two different shoe impressions were left in the dirt on a planting strip along the subject's route of departure. Casts of the shoe impressions have been submitted to the Washington State Patrol Crime Lab for testing. Video from the AM/PM and surrounding stores has been collected and reviewed. At this point, follow up investigation related to citizen tips have not led to information that would identify the subjects. Anyone with information reference the identity of the subjects involved in the robbery on 03-14-17 is being asked to call the Stanwood Police Department.

Child Abuse Case Update

The Island County Prosecutor's Office filed charges in the case and obtained a \$500,000 arrest warrant for the subject. On 03-14-17 at about 12:30am a witness reported seeing a vehicle parked at the Cornet Bay boat launch, before it was driven into the water. A male subject was later found deceased inside the vehicle. The male has been identified as the subject in the child abuse investigation.

Charges Filed in Burglary/Assault Case

The Snohomish County Prosecutor's Office has filed charges associated with a burglary/sexual assault investigation in November of 2016. The incident occurred in 8200 block of 276 PL NW. Initial court hearings are scheduled for June, 2017. The case should be resolved sometime later this year if it proceeds to trial.

Focus on Offenders

On 04-03-17 a subject associated with a nuisance residence was arrested on an outstanding warrant and found to be in possession of a controlled substance. Charges related to the possession of controlled substances have been referred to the Prosecutor's Office. On 04-06-17 a subject identified as one of Stanwood's most harmful criminals was arrested on a trespass complaint at a local store and booked into the Snohomish County Jail. A second subject identified as a most harmful criminal was recently incarcerated for failing to report to his Department of Corrections Probation Officer. The Probation Officer advised that this subject is living as a transient in the Everett area when he is not in jail.
