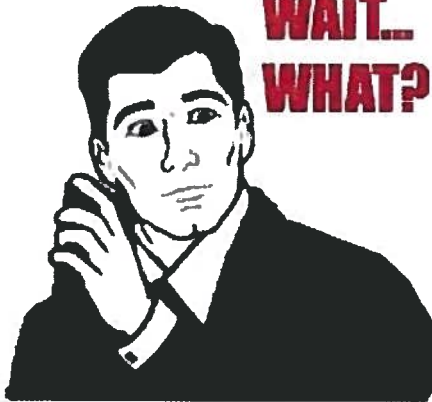

## MAY EVENTS

### SEX OFFENSES

Two sex offense cases were investigated. One case involved a male student exposing his penis while the class was watching a movie. A couple of students saw the exposure and were

uncomfortable with the students actions. This case has been referred to Denny Youth Center for possible charges.



The second case could be a felony in nature that involves child pornography and voyeurism. The initial investigation was for display of intimate images and cyberstalking. This case involved two male students and a female student. The males videotaped a sex act between them without the knowledge of the female. The males then shared the video with other persons. One male was 18 years of age at the time and the other was 17 years of age, but has since turned 18 years of age. This case has been referred to the special investigation unit with the Sheriff's Office.

### ASSAULT AND ALCOHOL



A student at Port Susan Middle School was upset another student may have made some remarks about her and wanting to fight. The student confronted the other student and tried to

get her to fight. The student refused to fight so the first student punched the student twice in the face. The student was brought to the office and the incident was investigated. The victim did not want to pursue charges.

The suspect student had earlier delivered VAPE equipment to another student. The student had the VAPE equipment delivered to the suspect's residence to avoid it being delivered to their own house. The school searched the suspect due to having the banned items. The search revealed the suspect had a bottle of watermelon vodka in her back pack. The student had a 22 year old purchase the vodka from Hagggen a couple of days prior. The suspect planned to drink the vodka with a friend after school. A case was referred to DYC for MIP.

## MAY EVENTS

### MARIJUANA

Three students at Lincoln Academy went into the bathroom and exchanged a baggie of marijuana. One student brought the marijuana from home where their parent grows it. The smell of the marijuana was noticeable and a report was made to the office.

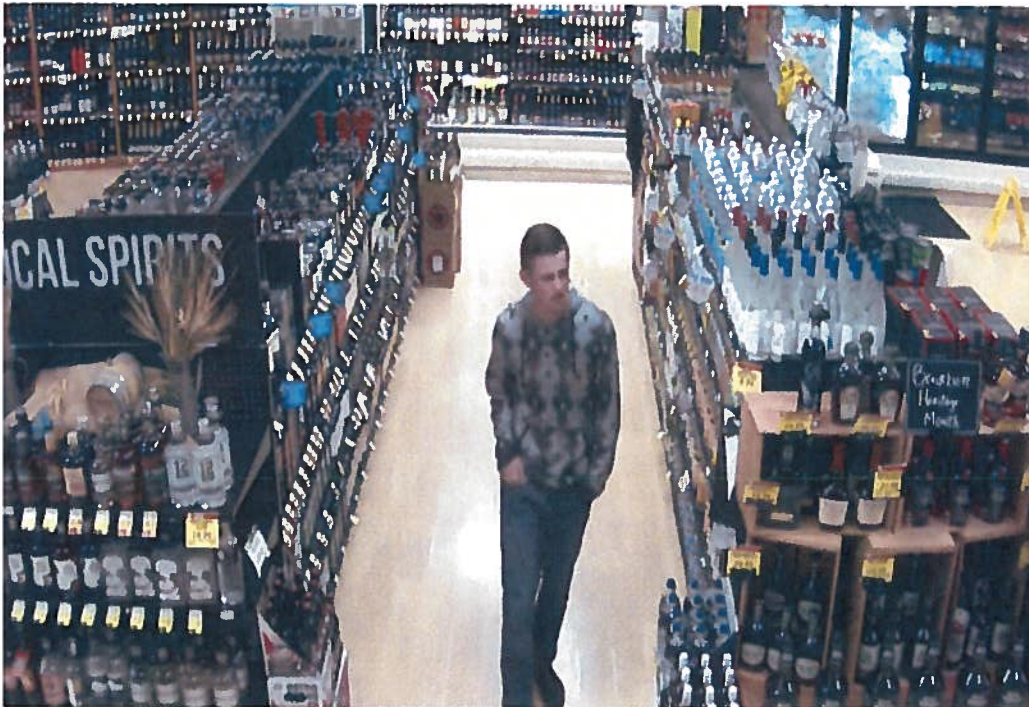


The students were brought to the office and eventually one of the students admitted to putting the baggie of marijuana in their crotch. The student stated when the principal was not watching she transferred the baggie from her pants to behind a cabinet in

the nurse's office. One of the other students was found to have three bottles in her back pack. These bottles had remnants of wine in them. The student stated she filled the bottles with wine from her house. The student said she drank the bottles at her house then concealed the bottles in her back pack. One of the other suspects stated she dumped the wine out in the toilet at school.

A case was referred on the one student for possession of marijuana and a case was referred on the second student for MIP.

## Possible Suspect Identification



On 09-04-16 two teenage males were involved in a theft and an assault at the Hagen Food Store in Stanwood. Only one of the males had been identified when charges were referred to the Prosecutor's Office in November, 2016. Detective Martin is currently following up on a tip received by a citizen that will likely lead to the identification of the second male subject.

## Theft of Jewelry

On 03-21-17 a citizen reported that she discovered jewelry missing from her home after using the services of a professional cleaning crew. A similar complaint involving the cleaning crew was made by a victim in the Granite Falls area. Detective Martin is currently working with a detective from the North County Property Crimes Task Force to attempt interviews with the cleaning crew employees. One of the employees has extensive history of pawning jewelry items.

## Guilty Verdict

On 11-01-16 Deputy Rasar and Detective Martin interviewed a male subject associated with an allegation of sexual assault at the Stanwood Senior Center. Deputy Rasar arrested the male at the conclusion of the interview and booked him on the charge of Indecent Liberties. Deputy Rasar and Detective Martin testified in the subsequent trial the week of 05-15-17. The jury found the defendant guilty of the lesser crime of Assault Fourth Degree with sexual motivation.

## Assault of a Child

On 05-15-17 a teenage male provided a statement alleging that he was assault by his step-mother in October, 2016, at an address within the City of Stanwood. Child Protective Services is investigating similar allegations against the mother involving her younger children. Detective Martin is attempting to arrange an interview with the mother. The case will be referred to the Prosecutor's Office at the conclusion of the investigation.



## Focus on Offenders

Stanwood Police have been focusing on reports of drug activity at the local parks and shopping center parking lots. Some of the associated subjects have been linked to a local nuisance property. Additional patrols in the area should reduce undesirable activity.
