OCTOBER EVENTS



October brought three cases involving marijuana or alcohol. One case of marijuana was when two students were in a vehicle on school grounds Vaping. Lincoln Hill High School Principal Ryan Ovenell contacted the students and

searched the vehicle. A jar and a commercially packaged zip lock baggie was found that contained marijuana. A large container was found that most likely contained ground up Liverwort (plant material that has some properties similar to marijuana) and a small amount of marijuana mixed in. "Dabs" was also located and paraphernalia to smoke the "dabs". The students received school discipline and were referred to NYC for charges.

A female student had her friend bring vodka to the Homecoming Dance in two Gatorade bottles. The student drank one of the bottles while standing in line to check into the dance. She was found highly intoxicated and unable to keep her balance, slurring her words, and emotional swings. She received school discipline, parents were contacted, and she was referred to NYC for charges.

The high school had fire alarm pull stations activated on two separate occasions without authorization. The school was evacuated and the fire department responded to clear the school.



The individuals that activated the alarms were identified in both cases and referred to NYC

for tampering with a fire alarm. One of the students was with a group of friends and hovered her hand over the pull station as a joke. A friend hit her hand so it would come in contact with the pull station which activated it. The second incident the individual stated he was mad at the world so he pulled the alarms.

There were two CPS referrals that had to be investigated. One case involved an incident that occurred sometime before school started and involved a middle school student and a 1st grade student. The second complaint involved a 1st grade student and boyfriend of the student's mother. Both cases were sent to CPS and the Special Investigations Unit of the Sheriff's Office.

On a lighter note Homecoming was this month and highly successful. The football team found more success and are in the playoffs. The volleyball team has won their district matches and are heading to the state tournament.

Country Store Burglary



During the early morning hours of 09-25-17, two subjects entered the Stanwood Country Store and removed multiple items to include clothing, tools and pet food.

Some of the stolen property was recovered the following day, after it was found hidden in bushes to the west of the store.

Detective Martin is currently reviewing store video and waiting on an itemized list of stolen items, before attempting interviews with potential suspects.
