SEPTEMBER EVENTS



The new school year started on September 6th with no problems on the first day. All sports teams have begun competitions by the first day of

school and hope for a successful season for football, girl's soccer, volleyball, girl's swimming, and cross country teams.

There were some fairly normal incidents for the first month to include marijuana possession, harassment and vaping. A couple of threat assessments were completed on students that made comments which could be potentially dangerous. No threat existed with either student. The crisis plan was updated for the high school to include new teachers and para-educators.



An unknown person hacked into the school district website in the evening of Sept 7th. The person placed an article on the website which said the school district was going to fly the gay pride flag on

Patriot's Day instead of the US Flag to support the LGBTQ community. The article was on the site for about 29 minutes before being discovered and removed. The investigation stalled when the IP address used to hack the site was for a person and address from Romania.

Prescription Fraud



Several sets of male suspects have been identified as being responsible for prescription fraud in Stanwood. The suspects have been linked to cases in Arlington, Marysville, Everett, Bainbridge Island, Anacortes, Richland, Spokane and several cities in Oregon and Arizona.

In most of the recent cases (2017), the suspects have offered to pay a female participant if they successfully pass a forged prescription for Oxycodone or Codeine-Promethazine cough syrup. The male suspects have driven away if the female participant is contacted by the police.

One of the male suspects associated with the Stanwood cases has been identified as a person attempting to pass forged prescriptions in several cases in Marysville and Everett in 2016. Detective Martin is coordinating with other agencies to get charges referred to the Prosecutor's Office in their respective jurisdictions.

The female shown in the photo above passed a forged prescription for Codeine-Promethazine cough syrup at a Walmart Pharmacy in Hermiston, Oregon on 08-10-17. The empty prescription bottle associated with this incident was located during a search warrant service on the car that the Stanwood suspects were driving.
