APRIL EVENTS



The first week of April was taken up with Spring Break. The three days preceding were half days at the schools in the district. The last week the juniors and seniors had delayed start due to mandatory state testing. The sophomore class was involved in the testing process. The freshman class came to school and had special activities.

One of the those activities was providing a presentation on the dangers of sexting. The freshman boys and girls were in separate groups. I provided a presentation to the boys along with the male school counselor and the dean of students. The school administration decided to have presentations due to the problems we have been having with sexting throughout the school year. The students were instructed on the meanings of sexting, the laws pertaining to sexting, and possible punishment for violating the law and the school rules.



I gave a presentation to the parents and students in the driver's education program concerning alcohol laws as they pertain to minors and driving. I also gave a presentation in the drivers education class on various subjects.

There were a couple of issues with marijuana and alcohol during the month that resulted in charges being referred.

Bartell's Burglary

On 04-12-17 at about 6:25 am Stanwood Police responded to a report of a burglary at the Bartell's Drug Store. The manager heard the store's alarm sounding when he arrived and later noticed that the glass on a window had been broken. A review of the store's video showed a younger male breaking the window and entering the store through the opening he created. The male smashed the glass on a cigarette case inside the store and stole several packs of cigarettes, before exiting the store through the broken window a short time later. Detective Martin processed the scene and lifted

several partial finger prints and shoe prints from the glass of the broken window. A detective from the Sheriff's Office Computer Forensics Unit collected video of the subject at a nearby gas station prior to the burglary. Still images of the subject were posted on social media. The subject has been identified as a juvenile male living in the Stanwood area. Police suspect that he is also responsible for a theft from the Haggan's Food Store on 04-03

-17. Due to the subject's lack of criminal history, the Denney Juvenile Justice Center will not allow him to be booked into the facility at this time. Charges are being referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Guilty Verdict

In April of 2016 a man met a woman at a casino in Marysville and took her to his home in the Granite Falls area. A short time after arriving at the house, the man forcibly secured the woman to a bed using ropes and proceeded to physically and sexually assault her. Detective Martin served as the managing witness at trial during the week of April 17th. The jurors found the defendant guilty of Rape Second Degree and Assault Second Degree.

Case Set For Plea

On 11-14-16 a male student brought a revolver to the Stanwood High School. The revolver was recovered when the student returned home after school. The Prosecutor's Office charged the case and recently advised that the case will not be proceeding to trial as the subject is set to plead guilty.

Focus on Offenders



Stanwood Police continue to work with Stanwood Code enforcement to address nuisance properties. Specific offenders were contacted by police during the month of April, but were not connected to specific crimes during that time frame.
