## Prescription Fraud

On 08-23-17 Stanwood Police responded to the report of prescription fraud at the Rite Aid Pharmacy. Sgt. J. Sanders and Deputy Chaney contacted the female pictured above in the parking lot. Deputy Scott stopped an associated car occupied by two males after it exited the rear parking lot of the store.

The female told police that she was driven to Stanwood from Seattle for the purpose of obtaining a controlled substance using the forged prescription. The female said she attempted to use the forged prescription at the QFC Pharmacy first. The female said one of males agreed to pay her for her involvement in the scheme.

Both males were arrested and booked into the Snohomish County Jail. Charges associated with the female's involvement are being referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Items seized during the execution of a search warrant on the car and the preliminary investigation indicates that this case is related to similar incidents in Stanwood, Arlington and Sultan over the last few months and may be linked to recent prescription fraud cases in Oregon and Eastern Washington.

Detective Martin has been working with law enforcement agencies from the affected areas to prepare the case for review by the Prosecutor's Office.
