PREVIOUS STUDENT DAMAGES CAR



A previous student of Stanwood High School is having an ongoing dispute with the family he had been living with. The student came to the school near the end of the school day with a 15 year old female from Marysville. The previous student drove around the parking lot and located the victim vehicle which is owned by the family the student has the dispute with. The previous student drove out of the parking lot and parked on 76th DR NW. The female ran back to the parking lot and knelt down by the victim vehicle. The female used an object and scratched the driver's door causing extensive damage. The repair estimate for the damage is in excess of \$900. The report was referred to the detective who contacted the female. The female admitted to causing the damage. A few more steps need to be taken and the case will be referred for felony malicious mischief.

EDIBLES



A student brought sugar cookies that contained marijuana to school. The cookies were baked by the student's mother and were taken without her knowledge. The cookies were given to three other students. One student did not know they contained marijuana and after eating the cookie she had an adverse reaction. The student had to be brought to the hospital for treatment. The student that gave the cookie and the student that provided the cookies were referred for possession of marijuana.

ADDITIONAL INCIDENTS

A student brought alcohol in a water bottle to Port Susan Middle School. The student was drinking the alcohol and shared some with other students. The student was referred for MIP.

CPS forwarded a report involving a possible sexual assault on a high school student. The incident took place four years ago and did not meet the criteria to constitute a crime.

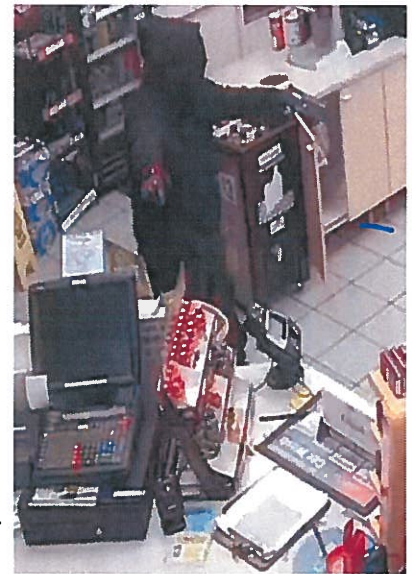
- AM/PM Robberies

On 12-29-17 at about 0335 hours a male dressed in black entered the AM/PM store located at 26930 104 DR NW, Stanwood, armed with a silver, large frame revolver. The male was dressed in dark colored pants and a dark colored sweatshirt, wearing gloves and had a fabric mask covering his face. The male demanded that the clerk give him the money from the register before fleeing the store on foot to the east. A K-9 unit responded, but the track stopped just out of the parking lot.

On 12-30-17 at 2335 hours the same male attempted to rob the gas station located at 26625 Old 99 N, Stanwood, but fled on foot after the owner confronted him. A K-9 unit responded and tracked south of the store and to the shoulder of southbound Interstate 5.

On 12-31-17 at about 0402 hours the same male entered the Stanwood AM/PM store wearing the same clothes and using the same gun. After taking the money from the register, the subject fled the store on foot. A K-9 unit responded and tracked a short distance north on 104 DR NW.

The same male is believed to be responsible for similar robberies in Marysville and Everett.



Detective Martin is following up on tips provided by the public and working with detectives from Everett and Marysville to identify the suspect.
