ALCOHOL AT SCHOOL

There were three separate occasions where alcohol was brought to school. Each incident involved putting the alcohol in either a water bottle or sports bottle and mixed with another type of drink. One incident involved two female students. One of the female students brought the alcohol to school after she heard her friend talking about drinking in the past and wanting to get some alcohol. The female student decided to bring the alcohol to school for her friend. The friend did drink some of the alcohol and was intoxicated at school. It was not determined where the alcohol was obtained from as the parent stated there was no alcohol at their home.



The other incidents involved female students who brought alcohol to school in water bottles. In one of the incidents alcohol was mixed with Crystal Light and the female was drinking during the day until she was brought to the office.



All people involved received school discipline and if they could be referred for MIP a case report was taken and referred. A part of proving MIP for someone that does not have physical control of the alcohol is the officer needs to detect an odor of intoxicants and the person has to be exhibiting the affects of being under the influence. In a couple of incidents the female students that were involved drank very little and there was a couple of hours between the time they drank and the time it was reported. These females did not meet the qualifications to be referred.

Each case was reported to the office by students that became aware of the alcohol being on campus. These students were either concerned about their friends or did not feel it was right to have alcohol at the school. One incident involved a female thinking the liquid was water. She asked for a drink and as soon as she took a sip she knew it was not just water. She returned the bottle and came to the office to report it.

CRISIS PLANNING

ADMINISTRATORS TRAINING

I provided training to all the school administrators in the area of lockdowns, modified lockdowns (lockouts), reunification, and the Run, Hide, Fight program. This training was conducted to bring all the schools onto the same plan concerning emergencies. Run, Hide, Fight was discussed and explained. It is the Homeland Security preferred response to an active event. A school has to make some alterations to the program when it involves elementary aged children. I also discussed actions that can be taken to prevent a person from entering the classroom and what actions should be taken between the time an incident occurs and the arrival of police officers.

The two reunification areas were reviewed and the procedures were discussed. The reunification area in Stanwood is the Cedarhome Baptist Church and the secondary location is the fairgrounds.

Special points of interest:

- ♦ A sexual assault allegation was reported at the high school. A female student claimed she was raped before school. The incident was investigated and the suspect was referred for rape 3.
- ♦ A couple of harassment cases were received and reviewed. The cases involved students from both middle schools. The harassments did not reach the criminal level. The school handled the incidents internally.
- ♦ A female senior reported being harassed and stalked by a patron at the YMCA. YMCA took action and suspended the patron for 30 days. A report was taken to document the incidents. The suspect has since moved to Everett and no further complaints have been made.
- ♦ A possible threat to the school was reported. This was investigated and it was found the information was from the fall of last year which had already been investigated. No credible threat was found.
- ♦ I had the opportunity to speak to several classes over the month. I spoke to drivers education on city driving, DUI, wearing seatbelts, and traffic stops. I spoke to the Civics class, and Business Law about search and seizure. I spoke to an English class concerning an officers view of the immigration policies that are being proposed.

Third Suspect Admits Involvement in Press Box Burglary

On 02-16-17 the third suspect involved in the High School Press Box burglary was interviewed at the Stanwood Middle School. The boy admitted his involvement in the burglary and confirmed the involvement of the other suspects. Charges for all of the suspects have been referred to the Prosecutor's Office for review.

New Leads in YMCA Theft Case

Over the last couple of months, the victim has provided documents showing the suspect's attempts to open credit accounts using the victim's personal information. One credit account application listed a local address and another listed Internet Protocol addresses associated with the suspect's web based applications. Detective Martin will be following up on this information in an attempt to identify the suspect.

Child Abuse Investigation

Detective Martin spent several weeks working on an investigation involving allegations of child sexual abuse that occurred over a period of 6-7 years. The investigation involved two victims and the incidents occurred in three different law enforcement jurisdictions. The Island County Sheriff's Office and Snohomish County Sheriff's Office assisted in the investigation and the arrest of the suspect. The Snohomish County Prosecutor's Office has filed charges in the case. Prosecutors from Island County and Yakima County will be reviewing the case for the potential of additional charges being filed in their respective jurisdictions.

Focus on Offenders

Another targeted offender was recently released from jail. Coincidentally, recent reports of vehicle prowls have gone up.

The police department will be also be focusing on nuisance properties within the City of Stanwood. We will be partnering with City Code Enforcement and Snohomish County Health District when necessary to address issues to include; squatting/trespass, furnishing liquor and/or drugs to minors and subject's whose actions are harmful to the community.



Essential Skills Training

Stanwood deputies will be attending essential skills training over the next several months. The training includes legal updates related to use of force, scenario based use of force training, annual Taser qualification and training related to the application of Lateral Vascular Neck Restraint (LVNR).



Allegation of Sexual Assault at the High School

On 02-16-17 a female student at the Stanwood High School reported that she had been sexually assaulted by a male student. Deputy Jensen interviewed the victim and several other students. The victim has been advised of the resources available at the Dawson Place Child Advocacy Center in Everett. The suspect declined to participate in an interview. The case has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office for review.
