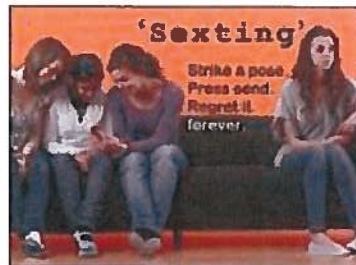
# SRO REPORT



## Sexting Problems Continue

Sexting continues to be a problem. A female student came into the counselor's office and stated she shared photos when she was in 7th grade. The student is now a sophomore. The student stated the boy she shared them with told her he still had the photos and was sharing them. The male was contacted and he denied keeping the photos or sharing them.

A female student came into the counselor's office with her mother. She reported she took some photos and shared them with upper classman. The female student stated the photos were placed on the Keep Safe app and were being shared. The student withdrew from school to attend a different district due to the situation. The alleged males were contacted. Both males admitted to receiving the photos, but they have since deleted them and stopped using the Keep Safe app.



## GUN AT SCHOOL

A volunteer with the Spirit Guard is a retired LAPD Officer. The volunteer had all the proper requirements to carry a concealed firearm on school grounds. The volunteer took his gun off when he went to the bathroom. The volunteer left the school and went to exercise. The volunteer came out of the facility and could not locate his firearm. The volunteer thought he left the gun in the bathroom at the high school. He came back to the school to advise school admin. The school was put into lockdown to search for the weapon. The school was in lockdown for about 15 minutes. The firearm was found in the volunteer's vehicle trunk. The weapon was never left unsecured at the school.

## Suspect Admits Involvement in Burglaries

Deputy Rasar lifted latent prints from a window in a burglary in January of 2016. In October, 2016, the Washington State Patrol Crime Lab identified the owner of the prints as a juvenile male from Camano Island. During a recent interview with the suspect at the Juvenile Detention Facility in Coupeville, he admitted his involvement in the burglary and identified two juvenile males who were with him. The suspect also admitted his involvement in a recent burglary of the stadium press box at the Stanwood High School. Additional suspects will be interviewed and charges will be referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

## Vulnerable Adult-Victim of Theft

An elderly female reported that her adult daughter misappropriated over \$200,000 from her estate between 2013-2015. The daughter was acting as a co-trustee and with power of attorney over the victim's trust account. The expenditures are alleged to have been outside the purpose and intentions of the trust account. The victim has been interviewed and Detective Martin is in the process of reviewing documents associated with the related Adult Protective Services Investigation.

## Annual Firearms Qualification

Stanwood deputies completed their annual firearms qualifications this month with issued pistols and rifles. Deputies will continue to train with firearms at the range every other month for the remainder of the year.
