Identity Theft

On 06-28-17 an employee at a local wireless store arranged for a friend to purchase an iPad on his behalf. The employee told the friend that the store's rules would not allow him to complete the transaction on his own.

The victim became aware of the fraudulent purchase when Verizon Wireless advised that they had exceeded their data usage. The subject used the customer's wireless data plan to download applications on to the iPad.

An image of the subject's friend was obtained from the store's security cameras and posted on the Stanwood Police Facebook page. The male was identified by a citizen a short time later. Detective Martin met with the male later in the day and learned that he was unaware that his friend, the store employee, had financed the purchase of the iPad on a customer's account without permission.

During a second interview with the store employee, he admitted using the customer's account to purchase the iPad and returned the iPad to Detective Martin. The charge of Identity Theft has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Recommended Items for Basic Emergency Supply Kit: Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days. At least a three day supply of non-perishable food. Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with extra batteries. Flashlight with extra batteries. First Aid Kit. Whistle. Dust mask. Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation. Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities. Can opener for food. Local maps. —FEMA

Prescription Fraud Update

Detective Martin interviewed the female subject in this case at her home in Seattle. She admitted her use of forged prescriptions in an attempt to obtain narcotics at two pharmacies in Stanwood and two pharmacies in the Arlington area. Detective Martin learned that similar forged prescriptions were presented at a pharmacy in Sultan earlier this year. The woman claimed that a male threatened to post photos of her on Facebook if she did not attempt to get narcotics for him using the forged prescriptions. The woman provided a description of the male, but said she met him at a club and only knew him by the name "Crew." The case will be referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Residential Burglary

Deputy Chaney responded to a residential burglary during the early morning hours of 07-31-17. The homeowner left a window open because of the recent heat wave. Two subjects entered through the open window and took several items from the house. The homeowner woke up and the subjects fled the scene. A K-9 track led to a nearby school, but was not successful in locating the subjects. Fingerprints were lifted and submitted for processing.



Focus on Offenders

Patrol deputies arrested several juvenile offenders this month. The boys are part of a group of teenage offenders that have been involved in multiple burglaries and thefts over the last few months. At least one of the subjects was released from jail after a short stay and is back in the Stanwood area, despite him having several cases awaiting disposition in the juvenile court process.
