The high school conducted a lockdown drill with cooperation of the police department. This was the first part of the joint operation. The school and police practiced communicating between the school incident command and the unified command post. We found the communication between the command posts was fairly smooth. The problems arose with using different channels that are not on the repeater. These channels are private channels that only the administration has access to. Communication between the Church Creek Campus and the Main Campus was limited causing some issues with communication between LHHS Principal Ryan Ovenell and SHS Principal Christine Gruver. The police had some initial problem with communication between the search team and the command post. The school and police will conduct a functional drill at the end of March.

### ALCOHOL/DRUGS



The high school again had an issue with a student being found in possession of dabs. The student was caught Vaping on school campus and during the search the plastic container with dabs was located. The student was referred for possession of marijuana to NYC.

One student at Lincoln Hill High School brought a water bottle to school that contained alcohol. The student gave the bottle to another student who drank the alcohol. The student was referred for MIP to NYC.

### ADDITIONAL INCIDENTS

A student at Lincoln Hill High School was seen Vaping during class. The student was brought to the office and would not turn over the MOD unit to the principal. The student was extremely angry and aggressive. I responded to the LHHS office and arrested the student after he assaulted the school security officer. There were no injuries and the student was transported and booked at NYC.

## Little Caesars Robbery



On 01-01-18 at about 1957 hours two subjects entered the Stanwood Little Caesars store wearing black hooded sweatshirts and masks. One of the subjects was armed with a small silver handgun. The armed subject removed the till from the cash register before both subjects fled the store on foot. The subjects likely left the area in a vehicle that was parked nearby. Detective Martin is following up on tips provided by the public, but the suspects have not been identified yet.

## Lake Goodwin Store Robbery



On 01-01-18 at about 2030 hours two subjects entered the Lake Goodwin store. The subjects appeared to be same two suspects that robbed the Stanwood Little Caesars store approximately thirty minutes earlier. The taller of the two subjects was armed with a small silver handgun. The armed suspect removed the till from a register, before both subjects ran out to a waiting vehicle. The vehicle appeared to be a silver or gold four door sedan. These suspects appear to be connected to similar robberies in the Seattle area.



## Northwest Plus Credit Union Robbery

On 01-12-18 at about 1745 hours one male subject entered the Stanwood branch of the Northwest Plus Credit Union wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, jeans, black shoes, a blue Seahawks hat and glasses. The male gave the teller a note that advised that he had a gun and instructing her to put all the money in a bag. The teller complied and the male left the bank on foot with the money in a plastic bag. The male was last seen on area video, running northbound past the east side of the bowling alley. An image of the bank robber was shown on Q13 Fox News. A short time later, the

suspect's mother and brother contacted a local police agency and identified the suspect. During the following days of investigation, it was determined that this suspect was also involved in the robberies at the Stanwood AM/PM store on 12-28-17 and 12-31-18. On 01-16-18 the Snohomish County Violent Offender Task Force located the suspect in the North Seattle area. The suspect was arrested and booked into the Snohomish County Jail on three counts of Robbery First Degree.

Detective Martin is currently working with detectives from the Burlington Police Department, Everett Police Department and Marysville Police Department as the investigation indicates that this same suspect was involved in several additional robberies in the above listed jurisdictions between 01-01-18 and 01-09-18.

## Luster Point Jewelers Burglary



On 01-29-18 at about 0230 hours a male subject broke a window and entered the Luster Point Jewelers building. The male removed several items of value before leaving the store. It is not known if the subject was associated with a vehicle. The Stanwood Police Department is currently investigating the case and attempting to identify the suspect.
