JUNE EVENTS

There were very few incidents in June. One incident involved an assault at SHS where one female pushed another female to the ground. The assault occurred because the victim had been tripping the suspect's boyfriend in PE class. A female was found in possession of marijuana and under the influence of Xanax at Lincoln Hill High School. A 9th grade female at SHS was found under the influence of alcohol (vodka). Each of these females were referred to Denny Youth Center for the various charges.

DETECTIVE REPORT

Indecent Exposure

On 06-06-18 Deputy Lafrance arranged to meet an adult female at the Stanwood Police Department to discuss an issue with a male neighbor.

The woman stated that the male lives in a townhouse across the street from her residence. A short time after the woman arrived home from work one day in May, 2018, she looked out her bedroom window and saw the male standing in front of the glass door on the top floor of his townhouse. The woman said the male was fully naked. The woman reported that she had seen the male standing in the same location without clothes on, on more than one occasion.

On 06-07-18 Deputy Lafrance and Detective Martin interviewed the male at the Stanwood Police Department. He admitted to standing naked in front of the glass door on the top floor of his residence, but claimed that he did not think anyone from outside his house could see him. This was not consistent with an earlier statement the male made expressing concern about the possibility of an elderly female neighbor seeing him when he walks around the inside of his house without clothes on.

The charge of Indecent Exposure was referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Identity Theft

On 06-13-18 an adult male reported numerous fraudulent purchases on his credit card.

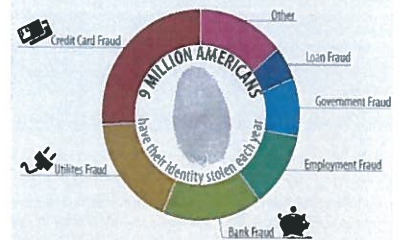
The male stated that he was at a local restaurant on 03-24-18 and called a female friend to pick him up. A witness at the restaurant observed the female friend pickup the victim's car keys and wallet and wait for him in her vehicle. The victim suggested that his female friend recorded his credit card information during the ten minutes she waited for him to come out of the restaurant.

HOW ID THEFT WORKS



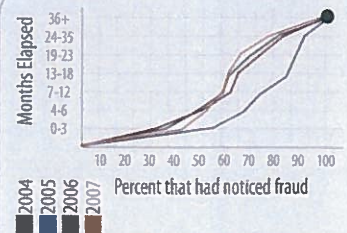
1 in every 10 U.S. consumers has already been victimized by identity theft



1.6 million households experienced fraud not related to credit cards (i.e. their bank accounts or debit cards were compromised)



7% of identity theft victims had their information stolen to commit medical identity theft



38-48% discover someone has stolen their identity within three months, while 9-18% of victims don't learn that their identity has been stolen for four or more years (Identity Theft Resource Center Aftermath Study, 2004).

Fraud/Identity Theft



On 06-19-18 Deputy Scott responded to a fraud complaint at the Josephine Sunset Adult Care Facility. A woman contacted the daughter of an elderly male and claimed that a recent ancestry test revealed that she (suspect) was the male's biological daughter. Over the following couple of months, the female suspect assisted the woman with applying for Medicare benefits for her father and arranging his stay at the adult care facility.

In May of 2018, the female suspect told the woman that she wanted to help with the male's finances. The female suspect attempted to get the male and his family to give her Power of Attorney over the male's affairs, but they declined. About a month later, the woman discovered that her father's social security check had been diverted to an address in Sedro Woolley. The female suspect lives in Sedro Woolley.

Detective Martin is investigating.
