MARCH EVENTS

THREATS



A couple of students at the two separate middle schools made threats to harm the school and/

or students. The threats involved a student saying he was going to shoot other students and another threatening the school administration. Both of the students were given school discipline, reports filed, and I completed a threat assessment on each student. Neither threat was found to be credible and the students were not an immediate threat. The students were found to have some mental health issues and were referred to the school psychologists.



Once again several students were assessed for suicide threats and suicide ideation. I am con-

tacted on all possible suicide threats to make a determination of imminent danger to themselves or others. This month all the students were released to their parents to arrange for additional help.

EDIBLES



Edibles were again being distributed at the high school. A student obtained the marijuana edible candies from a friend in Everett. The student currently resides at Co-

coon House and is transported to Stanwood High School. The candy was located during a search after a Snapchat message was shown to the assistant principal. The message advertised the candies being available for purchase. The student planned on selling the candies to purchase personal hygiene items and clothing. The student received school discipline and referred to DYC for possession of marijuana.

SAFETY DRILLS

The police department and the fire department partnered with Stanwood High School to conduct a functional high risk drill. The drill has been in the planning stages for several weeks. The high risk drill scenario was an active shooter and the school was put in lockdown. There were significant improvements in communication and operating an incident command.

QFC Store Theft



On 03-23-18 at about 3:23 am three males entered the Stanwood QFC store and forced open a register to gain access to the cash inside. The suspects attempted to force open a second register, but were not successful. Employees discovered the register's open cash drawer shortly after the incident occurred. Still images of the suspects were obtained from the store's video.

Vehicle Theft and Recovery

On 03-19-18 Deputy Chaney responded to the report of a vehicle stolen from the Stanwood High School. A teacher discovered that their vehicle was missing when they returned to the school at about 9:00 pm from a school function. A student reported seeing the vehicle near the Stanwood library and described the driver as a white male in his late teens.

On 03-20-18 Deputy Chaney recovered the stolen vehicle from a property in the 28300 block of 28th AV NW, Stanwood.

On 03-21-18 Deputy Chaney identified the vehicle theft suspect.

On 03-22-18 Stanwood Police contacted the suspect shortly after he walked past the police station, wearing some of the same clothing items that he was wearing the night he stole the vehicle. The suspect admitted being involved in the vehicle theft, but declined to provide a statement to Detective Martin.

Detective Martin is completing follow up investigation on the Stanwood robberies in preparation for a potential future trial.

Suspect Bites Store Owner

On 03-19-18 at about 11:15am Deputy Rasar responded to a theft complaint at a local grocery store. The adult female suspect left the store with items that she did not pay for. The suspect bit the store's owner on the leg when he attempted to detain her. The woman was booked into the Snohomish County Jail.



Stolen Vehicle Recovery

On 03-20-18 at about 5:06pm Deputy Scott responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle parked in the 8000 block of 283rd ST NW, Stanwood. A check of the vehicle's license plates did not reveal any information of concern, but Deputy Scott suspected that the car might be stolen. Deputy Scott checked the vehicle identification number and confirmed that the car had recently been stolen out of Everett. Deputy Scott arranged for the registered owner to pick up the car.
