## MAY EVENTS

### ASSAULTS



The high school had two reported assaults in the month of May. The first assault occurred in the beginning of the month between a male and female student. The male punched the female's breast twice and tried to kiss her. The male was referred for assault 4 with sexual motivation.

The second assault occurred between two male students over perceived comments that were made to a female student. The assault occurred at the end of school near the buses. The aggressor in the assault was referred for assault in the fourth degree.

### VAPE AND DABS



A female in a health class decided she did not want to be found with a "dabs" (concentrated THC) Vape pen. She offered the Vape pen to another female. This female refused to take it but she later found the pen in her back pack. The female tried to have a male take it to the bathroom during 6th period to dispose of it. The female did not bring the pen to the office or turn it over to the teacher. The teacher noticed the pen change hands and had both students brought to the office. The female was found in possession of the Vape pen. The "juice" in the pen was tested and found to contain THC. The female was referred for possession of marijuana less than 40g.

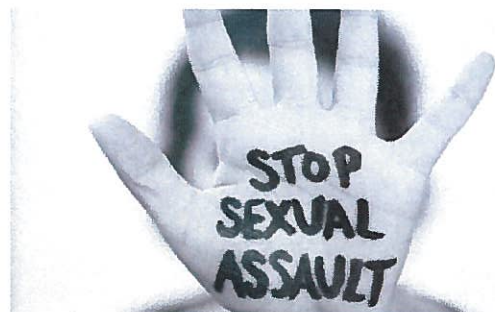
## Sexual Assault Case

In April 2018 a teenage girl met with a deputy at the Stanwood Police Department to report multiple incidents of assault by a teenage boy over the preceding couple of months at a residence in the City of Stanwood. Detective Martin was assigned the case in May and interviewed the victim and several potential witnesses. Detective Martin is in the process of collecting medical records and waiting for a response from the parents of the alleged teenage suspect as to whether or not he will be participating in an interview.

The case will eventually be referred to the Prosecutor's Office for review.

## Prescription Fraud Case Update

During the summer and fall of 2017, Detective Martin investigated several incidents of prescription fraud involving various pharmacies located within the City of Stanwood. The investigation revealed that a group of East African males from Seattle were creating forged prescription documents and using female accomplices to pass the forged scripts in attempts to obtain controlled substances from pharmacies across the State of Washington and in other states. Thanks to the work of Deputy Dan Scott, three suspects were arrested after attempting to pass a forged script at the Stanwood Rite Aid on 08-23-17. A subsequent search warrant service on an associated vehicle revealed the scope of their criminal enterprise and evidence to support charges related to prescription fraud. The Snohomish County Prosecutor's Office has reviewed related cases referred by agencies in Snohomish County to include the Stanwood Police and is preparing to charge the suspects. Detective Martin is working on a follow up investigation that involves getting statements from doctors who have been listed as prescribing physicians on the forged prescriptions and search warrants for phones and phone records as requested by the Prosecutor's Office.
