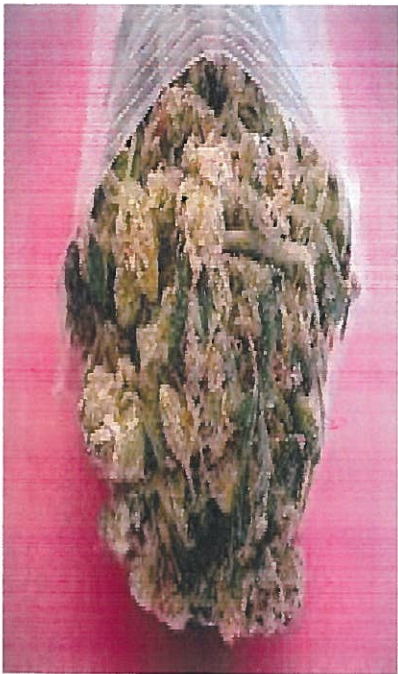

## SEPTEMBER EVENTS



The new school year started on September 10th after a one week delay due to contract negotiations. School started with no problems. All sports teams had begun competitions by the first day of school and hope for a successful season for football, girl's soccer, volleyball, girl's swimming, and cross country teams.



September was a good start to the year with only a couple of minor issues. The largest issue involved marijuana possession at Stanwood High School and Port Susan Middle School. Both incidents involved students being in possession of marijuana with a plan to sell it. Both students received school discipline and were referred to NYC. Other incidents of note were two collisions. One collision involved a student side swiping another vehicle on 272 ST NW when he was blinded by the sun. The other incident occurred in the stadium parking lot with a vehicle backing into another vehicle. There was only minor damage. A student at SMS was referred to CPS for possible abuse. CPS and Island County investigated the situation and determine the student was safe at his residence.



Vaping remains a huge issue in the schools. Several students have been disciplined at the high school and middle school for vaping or being in possession of vape equipment. The problem has been recognized by federal and local governments and hopefully new directives will be established to address this issue.

## Burglary Suspect Identified

On 08-31-18 at about 4:00am a subject pulled in front of the Striv Coffee House in Stanwood, in the white passenger car pictured above. The subject used an object to break the glass in the door of the business to gain entry. The subject took items from inside the business and drove away. Deputy Lafrance obtained video of the suspect and the associated vehicle from the YMCA.

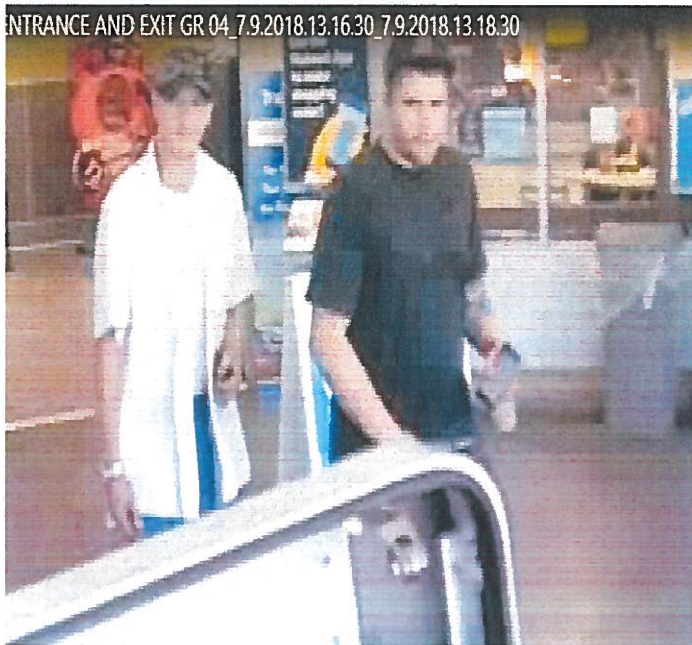
On 08-31-18 at about the same time in the morning, a suspect broke a window at the Pretty Nails & Tan salon in Stanwood. The suspect entered the business and took items from inside.

The week of September 10th, Detective Martin reviewed information from a Sheriff's Office Crime Analyst reference a burglary suspect operating in the south Snohomish County area. The burglary suspect had a similar method of operation to include breaking door/window glass to gain entry to businesses. Detective Martin contacted Snohomish County Sheriff's Office Detective Ainsworth and learned that detectives had interviewed a male suspect who admitted his involvement in nearly 50 burglaries in Snohomish and King Counties over the last several months.

On 09-13-18 Sheriff's Office and Snohomish Police detectives escorted the suspect to various locations around Snohomish County where he identified specific businesses that he burglarized. During this process the suspect admitted his involvement in both burglaries in Stanwood and provided specific details related to each crime. The suspect is currently in custody at the Snohomish County Jail.

Detective Martin contacted the Deputy Prosecuting Attorney assigned to the suspect's case and will be referring the Stanwood case to be included with cases from other jurisdictions.

## Suspect Admits Theft of Wallet



On 07-09-18 at about 1135 hours a woman left her wallet on a table inside the Stanwood McDonalds. Seconds later, the male shown in the photo (right) picked the wallet up and walked out to the parking lot.

The woman realized that her wallet was missing later in the day, when she received notification of unauthorized transactions on one of her credit cards at the River Rock gas station in Arlington and at the Tulalip Walmart.

Video from Walmart showed two males associated with the use of the victim's credit card. One of the men appeared to be the person who took the wallet from McDonalds.

Images of the suspects were posted on social media. Several citizens were able to identify the male wearing the black shirt.

On 09-18-18 Detective Martin interviewed the male wearing the black shirt at an address in Marysville. He told Detective Martin that he took the wallet from the Stanwood McDonalds and removed the cash that was inside. He said that he gave the wallet to another male whose name he could not remember. He identified the male wearing the white shirt as the person who used the victim's credit card.

Detective Martin identified two of the three males involved. The case has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office.
