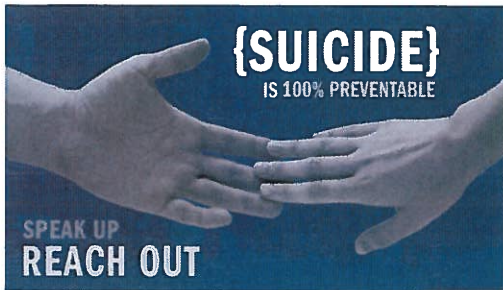

MENTAL HEALTH



Once again several students were assessed for suicide threats and suicide ide-

ation. I am contacted on all possible suicide threats to make a determination of imminent danger to themselves or others. This month a couple of students were transported to a hospital to have an evaluation completed. These two students were transferred to the Smokey Point Behavioral Hospital and were treated over multiple days. The other students were assessed and released to their parents for follow up care.

Youth suicide: the facts



- An average of 2 youth between the ages of 10 and 24 die by suicide each week in Washington State.
- 15% of WA 6th graders, 17% of 8th graders, 19% of 10th graders and 17% of seniors reported seriously considering suicide in the last year.
- Youth suicides outnumber youth homicides.
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death for WA youth.
- Suicide risk is reduced by increasing protective factors and working to change risk factors.
- Peers and adults outside the family play a key role in prevention.

SEXUAL ASSAULT REFERRALS



CPS brought two intake referrals that involved high school students being sexually assaulted. These reports involved their father or step-father being

accused of indecent liberties. The students were interviewed by CPS and myself. A report was taken in each case and referred to the Special Investigations Unit of the Sheriff's Office. Both assaults occurred at the homes of the students involved.

The third report was brought to me by the student support advocate at the high school. This report involved a female student alleging she was sexually assaulted by a male student at his home. The report was sent to the Special Investigations Unit for further follow-up for assault and attempted rape in the third degree.

Update Burglary/Sexual Assault Case

On 11-17-16 an adult male unlawfully entered a home in the 8200 block of 276 Place NW, Stanwood. The male walked into the bedroom of his adult female ex-girlfriend while she was sleeping and attempted to sexually assault her. The male was arrested by Stanwood Police and booked into the Snohomish County Jail.

The male recently agreed to plead guilty to charges of Residential Burglary and Assault Fourth Degree with Sexual Motivation. His expected sentence will fall somewhere between 6-12 months.

Burglary/Theft of Firearms

On 04-09-18 Deputy Chaney responded to the report of a burglary at a residence in the 9700 block of 272nd Place NW, Stanwood. The victim returned home from work to find that their apartment had been entered and ransacked. Several items were taken to include two firearms and a motorcycle.

Deputy Chaney lifted fingerprints from several locations in the home to include the suspected points of entry and exit. The fingerprint lifts have been submitted to the Washington State Patrol Crime Laboratory for processing.

The victim reported that their vehicle had been prowled at a location in South Everett several days earlier and that their house keys had been stolen. It is suspected that the suspect gained entry to the apartment using the house keys.



Construction Site Theft

On 04-16-18 Deputy Rasar responded to the report of a burglary from a residential construction site in the 6500 block of 278th Street NW, Stanwood. A suspect used a bolt cutter to remove the lock from a metal shipping container, sometime during the preceding weekend. The victim reported that miscellaneous tools and about two dozen residential electrical service boxes were missing. The loss was estimated to exceed \$12,000.00. There is no suspect information at this time.
