## December Newsletter

December was a fun month at the Stanwood Camano School District. Many schools had spirit week which included theme days where students dressed certain ways, such as pajama day, holiday hat day, and twins day - among others. Stanwood High School had their "Winter Wishes" assembly and a few students were able to get what they wished for. A good time was had by all in attendance. The boys basketball team is 6-3 overall on the season, and the girls are 5-4. Boys and girls wrestling continue to see successes, with the girls team taking 3rd place at the Dec. 29th Woolley Women's Wrestling Tournament. The Port Susan Robotics Club is seeing success

with 27 students in the new after school program, while the already established Utsalady Elementary program participated in the FIRST Lego League Tournament on December 1st.



Vaping continues to be an issue... not only at Stanwood Schools, but it is now recognized by the US FDA as an alarming trend nationwide. A 2016 report from the US Surgeon General cites a 900% increase in the use of e-cigarette use by high school students from the years of 2011-2015. Some attribute the rise in use by students to the flavors targeted toward younger people - flavors such as tutti-frutti, cotton candy, and sour gummy worms. The problem is most of these vape devices are small, and resemble a thumb-drive. Most do contain nicotine which is highly addictive, and some contain THC, found in marijuana. The district is looking at proactive ways to

tackle this problem instead of a strict "you're suspended for 3 days" approach. Possibly a "diversion program" where students will be required to attend classes to learn about the dangers of vaping and THC use.

#### **Stolen Checks-Forgery**

On 12-10-18 Deputy Scott contacted a male reference checks stolen from his mailbox in the Church Creek neighborhood. One check was forged and used at a bakery in Issaquah. Two additional checks were forged and used in attempted purchases of \$1000.00 and \$1300.00 from a private party via Craigslist.

Deputy Scott contacted an employee at the bakery who described one of the involved subjects as a female with brown hair and glasses.

Detective Martin is attempting to identify a business associated with the use of the victim's checks with video of the involved subject.

#### **Stolen Purse**

On 12-15-18 Deputy Weekes contacted a female at McDonalds reference a stolen purse. The female reported that she left her purse inside the store and discovered it was

missing when she returned to collect it a short time later.

Store video showed a juvenile male had taken the victim's purse and put it under his sweatshirt, before walking out the front door.

The subject has been identified as transient male living in the Stanwood area.

Detective Martin will be collecting video from businesses where the victim's credit cards were used and attempting to locate the male in the Stanwood area.

#### **Fraud**

On 12-18-18 Sgt. Toner contacted a woman at the Stanwood Police Department reference a fraud complaint. The woman received a letter in the mail with a check for \$1950.00. The letter stated a company wanted to hire her for work associated with brand auditing and quality control. The letter instructed the woman to deposit the check and

purchase an Apple gift card for \$1690.00. The letter instructed the woman to provide the gift card serial number to a phone number via text message. The woman became suspicious when the person she was communicating with became very pushy demanded the gift card's serial number. The woman eventually realized she was involved in a scam after contacting her bank and researching the company online.
