FEBRUARY EVENTS

ASSAULTS



Several assaults occurred during the month of February. In early February three girls felt the victim had been making comments about one of their

friends. The three girls approached the girl to confront her. The victim tried to walk away, but one of the girls pulled her hair and pulled her to the ground. The other two girls proceeded to kick her and throw food/juice at her. The three girls were referred for assault.

A teacher at Lincoln Hill High School was assaulted while trying to separate two male students in a physical confrontation. The teacher was punched in the head and suffered a small cut. The teacher did not want to file criminal charges.

A male student became upset after a victim was posting derogatory remarks about him and his foster sister. The victim has also been making fun of the suspect's weight. The suspect confronted the victim and assaulted him. The victim did not retaliate. Suspect referred for assault.

A male student bought a coffee and put a laxative in it. The coffee was left on the victim's desk who drank it. This was over previous comments made between the two students. Suspect referred for assault.

THEFT AND MALICIOUS MISCHIEF



Two teachers had issues with their property where students were suspected of damaging a truck and stealing a phone.

The first teacher had his truck parked in the back parking lot. He came out after school and found an unknown person had caused damage to the top front of the cab of the truck. A student was suspected, but no evidence could be found to support the suspicion.

A second teacher had his cell phone sitting on his desk during class. The teacher noticed the phone missing after class. The three students sitting near the desk were questioned and one of these students was found in possession of the phone. The student was referred for theft.

ADDITIONAL INCIDENTS

Three separate students made some sort of threat using social media, written note, and/or using hand gestures. The threats were not specific and no specific students were threatened. Each student was contacted and a threat assessment was done. The assessment found the students were not a threat.

A small amount of marijuana was found in possession of a student at LHHS. The student was referred for possession of marijuana.

Robbery Investigation Update

The Snohomish County Prosecutor's Office has charged an adult male with three counts of Robbery First Degree related to his involvement in the Northwest Plus Bank Robbery on 01-12-18 and the Stanwood AMPM robberies on 12-28-17 and 12-31-17.

Search warrants were served on the subject's vehicle that produced additional evidence for the Stanwood cases and linked the subject to other area robberies.

Detective Martin is working with detectives from the Marysville Police Department, Everett Police Department and Burlington Police Department on developing probable cause for additional charges related to robberies in other jurisdictions.

Luster Point Jewelers Burglary Update

On 02-07-18 a female citizen called the Stanwood Police Department with information reference the Luster Point Jewelers burglary that occurred on 01-29-18 at about 0230 hours. The woman met with Detective Martin and provided information that led to the identification of the adult male who was involved in the burglary.

The male and two adults females were in town for a week, visiting a Stanwood resident. The group is from Spokane and they returned home sometime around the beginning of February.

Law enforcement resources revealed that during the days following the burglary, several items that were stolen from the jewelry store had been sold at pawn shops in Arlington and Marysville.

Deputy Dan Scott recovered the stolen items from the local pawn shops and returned them to the owner of the jewelry store. Additional items that were stolen during the burglary have been recovered from acquaintances of the robbery suspect and will eventually be returned to the victim.

Deputy Scott completed the investigation and has referred charges to the Prosecutor's Office.

Theft of Firearm/Unlawful Possession of Firearm

On 03-12-17 Deputy Rasar investigated a case involving the theft of several firearms from a residence. Deputy Rasar determined that the male suspect was ineligible to possess firearms due to mental health concerns. Deputy Rasar found the male suspect in possession of the firearms and referred charges to the Prosecutor's Office, both for the theft and the possession.

Detective Martin test fired one of the recovered firearms at the request of the Prosecutor's Office. The case is proceeding to trial the week of 03-12-18.

Apartment Burglary Update

On 04-16-17 Deputy Veach investigated a burglary complaint at an apartment in Stanwood. The subject broke a window to gain entry to the apartment and took items to include an electronic device.

Deputy Veach examined the point of entry and observed finger prints on the exterior of the window. Deputy Veach lifted the prints and submitted them to the Washington State Crime Lab for testing.

The Washington State Patrol Crime Lab identified the owner of the finger prints as an adult male who is currently in prison related to a Skagit County case. The male had previously been identified as one of two suspects involved in the Stanwood AMPM robbery that occurred on 03-14-17.
