## Prowlers At New High School Construction Site:

On two different incidents, unknown suspects entered the locked fenced area of the new Stanwood High School construction area. Cameras picked up the suspect(s) which triggered an automatic alarm to the construction company. Construction staff members review these alarm videos and call 911. Deputies met with the construction site foreman and toured the entire facility, learning easy access points, and learning where all the cameras are located. Procedure has been streamlined as well. Instead of phone calls being made to construction staff first, now the alarm company will call 911 first to help get Deputies there faster. No major damage has resulted from the prowlers, just some spray paint on concrete that will be covered anyway, and some fire extinguishers that had been set off. No suspect information, more than likely kids.

## To The Moon and Beyond

Astronaut Yi So-yeon, Korea's first and only Astronaut to fly in space came to Stanwood High School's Performing Arts Center on November 23rd. ## Detective Report November Newsletter



### **UPDATE: Vehicle Prowl and Identity Theft**

On 10-17-19 Deputy LaFrance responded to a vehicle prowl complaint. The victim's purse was stolen from the front passenger seat of her car. The victim's credit card was used at businesses in Stanwood and Arlington.

The suspect was identified after photos were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page.

The same suspect took a gun from a car in Mountlake Terrace during the first week of November. Mountlake Terrace Police arrested the suspect at a methadone clinic in Everett on 11-12-19.

**Detective Martin booked the suspect at the Snohomish County Jail on additional charges related to the Stanwood case.**



### **Stanwood Case 2019-8748 Burglary**

On 11-07-19 Deputy LaFrance responded to a theft complaint at the Country Store. The store manager discovered a leaf blower missing from the storage/loading bay on 11-06-19.

Store video showed a male enter the loading/storage bay prior to the business being open for customers. Video shows the male carrying a leaf blower as he leaves the storage/loading area.

Images of the suspect were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page. The suspect was identified by several people including his father.

**The male is reported to be staying at a Tulalip address. Detective Martin will be working with the Tulalip Police Department to locate the male.**

### Stanwood Case 2019-8848 Burglary

On 11-11-19 at about 0400 hours Deputy Chaney responded to an audible alarm at a local car wash. No one was at the business when Deputy Chaney arrived, but a door had been pried open.

The business owner provided video later in the day showing a male subject prying the door open and taking things from inside the building.

Images of the suspect were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page. The suspect was identified as a recent Camano Island resident.

Detective Martin is working with the Island County Sheriff's Office and Swinomish Police Department to locate the suspect.

## HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS



### SHOPPING

- Stay alert to your surroundings – trust your instincts; if something doesn't feel right, it's probably not – call 9-1-1
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash
- Do not leave purse/wallet in shopping carts
- Get keys out of pocket/purse before leaving the store
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to open car doors, use cell phones etc.
- Do not leave packages in vehicle. If changing locations, put them in trunk BEFORE you leave one destination and get to the other
- Park in well lit areas
- Try to use an ATM that is located inside a mall, grocery store or well lit location. DO NOT leave car unlocked or purses, wallets in car (even if locked) while you are at a walk up ATM, Red Box or coffee window
- Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost or stolen
- Protect PIN numbers when using debit cards

### AT HOME

- Lock doors and windows when you leave the house, even if it's for a few minutes
- When leaving home for an extended period of time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house, pick up mail & newspapers, or you can put a hold on mail and newspaper delivery
- If expecting a package from UPS, USPS or Fed Ex, and are not going to be home, track your packages on-line, ask a neighbor to pick it up for you, request a signature for proof of delivery to ensure that someone is home, research delivery options
- Indoor and outdoor lights can be on an automatic timer
- Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows or doors of your home
- Do not leave boxes from large or small purchases visible on or before garbage day; doing this allows others to see what new things you have in your home
- If someone knocks on your door and you don't recognize them, you don't have to answer the door, but let them know you are home – teach children to do the same. If they seem suspicious call 9-1-1 immediately
- Always donate to a recognized charitable foundation – if someone calls or is at your door, ask for their identification and question how the funds will be used. If it seems suspicious, call 9-1-1 immediately
