STANWOOD CAMANO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAFETY TASK FORCE

As the Director of Student Services and Safety, Mark Carter has been tasked with the creation and leading of the Stanwood Camano School District Safety Task Force. The Safety Task Force has met several times since its inception in September 2019. The Safety Task Force has been created to address concerns about school safety and emergency preparedness, based on a 2019 Stanwood Camano School District Safety Audit. The Safety Task Force group has been divided into several sub-groups to brainstorm and come up with creative solutions to safety. The groups are:



Training Focus Group - This group will come up with different types of training for staff, and students such as emergency preparedness, search and rescue, and “stop the bleed” and basic first aid.

Safety Plans Focus Group - This group is responsible for overseeing the creation and implementation of an overall district safety plan, that will be copied down to individual school safety plans.

Communications Focus Group - This group will discuss not only communication within the safety planning between schools and district, but the actual physical aspect of communications during an emergency event, such as digital radios, ham radios, etc.

Supplies Focus Group - This group will come up with ideas for general preparedness supplies for our schools, and will research best practice storage and distribution plans.

Reunification Focus Group - This group will work with current reunification plans to review and update any needed information. The group will work to coordinate with Camano Chapel and Cedarhome Baptist Churches to make sure the facilities plans are up to date, and to make sure proper supplies are stored at each location. Further, this group will work to establish the Stanwood Camano Fairgrounds as a backup reunification location.

STANWOOD CASE 2019-10285 VEHICLE PROWL

On 12-31-19 Deputy Scott contacted an adult female in the 9700 block of 272 PL NW, Stanwood. The woman's unsecured vehicle was prowled sometime during the night and several items of value, to include a purse were stolen.

On 02-04-2020 the victim provided specific information associated with the unauthorized use of her credit/debit cards on the day of the incident. Detective Martin was able to get video from one of the transaction locations and identified the suspect as one of Stanwood's prolific offenders.

Attempts to collect additional video evidence will be made as the investigation continues.

Stanwood Case 2020-240 Assault Second Degree Domestic Violence

On 01-09-2020 a woman reported her ex-husband threatened to kill her while displaying a handgun during a child custody exchange at Heritage Park in Stanwood. The male was arrested the following morning and participated in an interview, before being booked into the Snohomish County Jail.

Several search warrants have been served and potential evidence has been seized.

The male is currently in custody at the Snohomish County Jail with a bail amount of \$250,000.00.

Stanwood Case 2019-8848 Update Burglary



On 11-11-19 at about 0400 hours Deputy Chaney responded to an audible alarm at a local car wash. No one was at the business when Deputy Chaney arrived, but a door had been pried open.

The male suspect was identified after images were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page.

On 01-02-2020 Detective Martin arranged for the suspect's arrest at an address in the City of Marysville. The subject denied being involved in the burglary and requested an attorney during an attempted interview.

The suspect was booked into the Snohomish County Jail.

Stanwood Case 2020-188 Theft

On 01-07-2020 Deputy Scott responded to a complaint of theft from a local auto parts store. The victim provided a description of the female suspect and of an associated vehicle. Deputy Scott stopped the car on State Route 532, arrested the female suspect and placed her in his patrol car. The male driver was also arrested after Deputy Scott determined he was violating a court order by having contact with the female.

Detective Martin spoke with the female and recovered one stolen item after she admitted hiding it between the seats of Deputy Scott's patrol car. The woman wrote a note apologizing for the theft.
