STANWOOD SPORTS

Stanwood boys basketball ended up 11 –3 in league, and 16-7 overall. They entered the post-season with an exciting win over Arlington 63-61, but fell to Shorecrest and Meadowdale shortly thereafter. Girls basketball went 6-8 in league, and 8-13 overall. Stanwood boys wrestling wrapped up another successful season with a 5-1 league record and a 9-2 overall record, with a handful of wrestlers placing at the State tournament. Coach Ray Mather was awarded Coach of the Year by the Snohomish County Wrestling Officials Association!



PARKING ISSUES

Parking is still an issue as construction continues. As more students turn 16 during the school year, more students are driving to school causing even more frustration. Students continue to park in the neighborhood across from Lincoln Hill High School which is a “Permit Parking” only area. This parking issue has grown from 2-3 cars parking there daily, to more than a dozen now. Stanwood Police patrol units continue to field 911 calls from angry neighbors about students parking there congesting the neighborhood, leaving trash, and driving fast. Arguments have broken out between students and neighbors in the area causing even more 911 calls. Stanwood High School has been in talks with the Senior Center above the stadium to open up approximately 80 more parking spots, however, the Senior Center has decided to charge \$50 per semester which many students say is too high. The Stanwood Police Department is in an uncomfortable situation where the citizens expect parking laws to be enforced, however the students really do have no place to park. Parents are now getting involved, growing angry at the school for not providing proper parking, which causes their students to get tickets and park dangerously. Students recently tried to stage a protest and arrive early and steal the staff parking spots. Staff were aware of the staged protest and were able to put security measures in place to make sure staff spots weren’t stolen. Parents were rumored to be taking part in the protest as well. The school points out that they offer free transportation in the form of school busses, but that apparently is impractical to some students and parents.

Stanwood Case 2018-3338 Update Indecent Exposure

On 06-06-18 an adult female came to the Stanwood Police Department to report an adult male neighbor she had seen masturbating on more than one occasion. The woman provided video clips she recorded on 05-25-18, showing what appeared to be a naked white male standing in plain view, in front of the unobstructed glass of a door on the top floor of a townhouse overlooking the woman's home. The male appeared to be masturbating in both video clips. The woman stated she had seen the male doing this 6-7 other times, consistently around the time she would arrive home from work.

Deputy Lafrance and Detective Martin interviewed the male at the Stanwood Police Department on 06-06-18. The male admitted to standing naked and masturbating in front of the glass door on the top floor of his residence. The male claimed he chose the location because it was warm and did not think anyone outside his home could see him.

The crime of Indecent Exposure was referred to the Prosecutor's Office on 06-11-18.

The male plead guilty to the crime of Indecent Exposure in September, 2019. A Cascade Division Court Judge gave the defendant a deferred sentence (no jail time).

Stanwood Case 2020-736 Forgery

On 01-29-2020 Deputy Fuchs responded to a fraud complaint and contacted a female resident at an adult care facility in Stanwood. The victim reported checks stolen from her room and successfully cashed by her granddaughter for more than \$2000.00.

Deputy Fuchs requested video of the suspect depositing the forged checks at BECU.

The victim declined to pursue charges in the case, because her granddaughter has children and suffers from drug addiction.

Stanwood Case 2020-1407 Identity Theft

On 02-19-2020 Sgt. Gilje responded to the report fraud and contacted an adult female by phone. The victim received a notification on her phone reference several suspicious transactions associated with her husband's debit card at a store in Bonney Lake, WA. The woman told Sgt. Gilje her husband's debit card is in his possession and he did not make the purchases in Bonney Lake.

Detective Martin is working with Fred Meyer Loss Prevention to get video associated with the transactions.
