Stanwood Case 2020-3188 Burglary

On 04-28-2020 Deputy Scott responded to a report of a theft from a secured area of the Country Store. The store manager reported a lawn mower stolen from inside a fenced area while the store was closed.

Store video showed the male inside the fenced area in front of the store. The male removed a lawn mower and was last seen pushing it as he traveled westbound from the business. The store manager recognized the male as past customer and reviewed video footage from one of his previous visits.

Sgt. Gilje recognized the male from past contacts, despite his attempt to obscure his face with some type of cloth. The male was located, arrested and booked into the Snohomish County Jail by Deputy Clarkson on 04-30-2020. At the time of his arrest, the male mentioned he could be positively identified as the suspect, because his face was covered.

The lawn mower has not been recovered.

Stanwood Case 2020-3016 Identity Theft



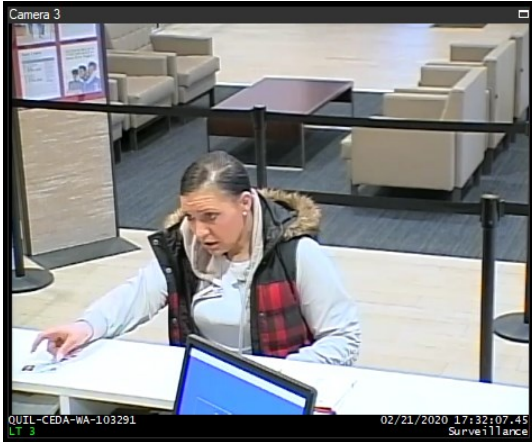
On 04-21-2020 Deputy Scott responded to a theft complaint and learned the victim's wallet had been stolen from the QFC store on 04-03-2020. The victim decided to report the theft after discovering fraudulent charges on one of his credit cards.

Detective Martin obtained video from the locations where the fraudulent transactions occurred. Video showed a male with a beard wearing a knit cap and hooded sweatshirt associated with the fraudulent transactions. Images of the subject have been shared with local law enforcement in an attempt to identify him. He is believed to be a resident in the Stanwood/Camano area.

Stanwood Case 2019-8556 Update Burglary/Forgery



On 10-31-2020 a local business was burglarized and items stolen to include business checks. On 02-21-2020 the business owner was contacted by staff at the Bank of America Quil Ceda Village Branch to advise a woman was in the bank attempting to cash one of the business checks. The woman presented the forged check and Washington State Driver's license to the teller, but left both behind while bank staff was attempting to verify the check.

On 03-25-2020 Detective Martin obtained a search warrant for video from the bank. Bank of America provided the video on 04-30-2020. The video showed the woman present the forged check and her identification to the teller. The woman in the video appeared to be the same person shown on the Washington Driver's license the suspect left behind.

Detective Martin is attempting to locate the woman. The charge of Forgery is being referred to the Prosecutor's Office.
