Stanwood Case 2020-5739

Woman attempting to sell stolen watch.



On 07-29-2020 Deputy Skidmore responded to a vehicle prowl complaint involving the theft of an Apple watch.

On 07-30-2020 the victim contacted Deputy Lafrance and advised her watch had been recovered. The victim found her watch for sale on OfferUp. The victim's husband met the female seller in the Haggens parking lot and took the watch from her after confirming the serial number matched his wife's watch. The woman said she was selling the watch for a friend and did not know it was stolen.

At one point during the victim's communication with the seller on OfferUp, the seller told her the watch was in her boyfriend's car. The victim provided images of the seller. The seller was identified as the girlfriend of the male suspect identified in Stanwood Case 2020-5087.

Detective Martin developed probable cause for the arrest of the female subject.

On 08-13-2020 Detective obtained a search warrant for a vehicle and motor home linked to the couple mentioned above. Sgt. Gilje and Deputy Clarkson contacted both subjects later in the day and arrested them.

Detective Martin, Sgt. Gilje, Sgt. Toner and Chief Martin served the search warrant on the vehicle and motor home and recovered stolen property belonging to multiple victims.

Additional items observed during the search warrant service included various brands of cordless drills, electronic devices, flashlights and charging cords. The presence of these items was consistent with items commonly possessed by a prolific vehicle prowler. The male and female subjects were released from jail the following day. The Prosecutor's Office is reviewing the cases in order to make a charging decision.



Detective Martin has contacted several owners associated with the recovered property and learned they were victims of vehicle prowls in locations to include Mukilteo, Everett, Marysville, Mukilteo, Mount Vernon and Burlington.

Detective Martin developed probable cause for the arrest of a male subject associated with several vehicle prowls that occurred in the Stanwood area on 07-07-2020.
