### Stanwood Case 2020-4729 Vehicle Prowl/Identity Theft



On 06-25-2020 Deputy Skidmore contacted a woman reference a vehicle prowl (Stanwood Case 2020-4723). The woman was at Heritage Park and left her vehicle unsecured with the windows down. When she returned to her car she discovered several items missing to include her purse. Her purse contained an access device which was used for an attempted purchase at the Stanwood QFC store and several purchases at the Stanwood Rite Aid store, within about thirty minutes of the vehicle prowl.

Detective Martin obtained video associated with the unauthorized transactions from QFC. The images of the subjects have been posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page.

### Stanwood Police Case 2020-5240 Vehicle Prowl

On 07-13-2020 at about 3:00am Deputy Kuska responded to a vehicle prowl complaint in the 28000 block of 73 AV NW, Stanwood.

A girl woke her father up after the outside motion lights came on and she saw the shadow of a human figure. The girl's father went outside and discovered the door to his neighbor's car open, with a male inside the car. The father and the neighbor detained the subject until police arrived. Police searched the subject and found the victim's property on his person.

The subject was arrested and booked into the Snohomish County Jail.



## Stanwood Police Case 2020-5087 Vehicle Prowl/Identity Theft



On 07-07-2020 Deputy Scott responded to the report of a vehicle prowling in the 6400 block of 281<sup>ST</sup> ST NW, Stanwood. The victim reported a wallet containing a debit card stolen from his vehicle. A short time later, the victim received notification his debit card was used at the Walmart, Safeway, Lowe's and McDonalds in Arlington and the Target in Marysville.

Detective Martin obtained video from each of the locations the debit card was used. One video showed the subject without a mask and a partial license plate number on the vehicle he was driving. The subject was identified as a person who has been involved in numerous criminal investigations in Stanwood over the past ten years.

The subject is believed to be responsible for several vehicle prowls in the Stanwood area over the last two months.

The subject is currently in the Snohomish County Jail on an unrelated matter.

### How to Protect Your Property

About half of the video collected by the police department comes from citizen owned video systems. The videos repeatedly show the suspect(s) walking or riding a bike through a neighborhood, checking car doors. If the doors are locked the suspect usually moves on.

None of the last 10-15 reported vehicle prowls in Stanwood involved forced entry into the victim's vehicle.

- **Do not leave your vehicle unsecured when you are not in it.**
- **Do not leave your purse, wallet, cell phone, laptop, firearm etc. in your vehicle at night.**
- **If you routinely leave items of value in your vehicle, make sure they are not visible when looking in from the outside.**
- **Always lock your vehicle.**
- **Report suspicious activity in your neighborhood by calling 911 . It is not normal for a person to be walking around your neighborhood, while wearing a mask and carrying a back pack at 3:00am.**
- **Always lock your vehicle.**
