Stanwood Case 2021-2630 Theft

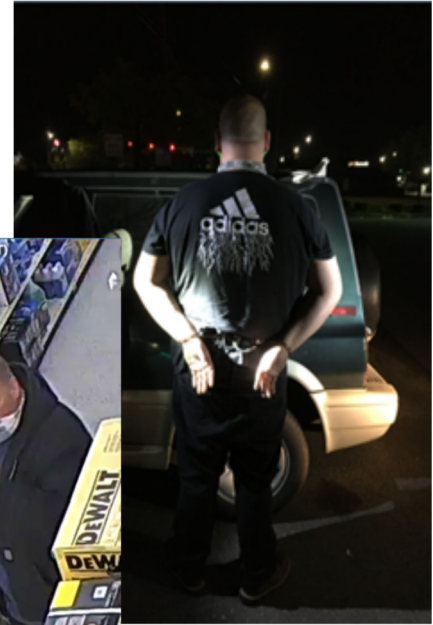
On 04-15-2021 Deputy Scott responded to a theft complaint at the County Store. The store manager reported the theft after a man pushed a shopping cart full of merchandise through an emergency exit door.

Images of the subject and his car were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page and sent to area law enforcement agencies.

The subject and his vehicle were identified by officers with the Arlington Police Department.

Deputy Scott and Detective Martin attempted contact with the man at an address in the Island Crossing area of Arlington. The subject was not there, but a resident provided a statement confirming the man's identity after viewing images of the theft suspect and his car.

On 05-06-2021 the subject was contacted by Arlington Police during a traffic stop. Deputy Schrader arrested and booked the subject into the Snohomish County Jail.



Update Stanwood Case 2021-0745 Organized Retail Theft



On 03-11-2021 Deputy Chitwood and Detective Martin attempted contact with the female suspect at her apartment in Marysville. Neighbors reported the woman was home, but she did not respond to knocking on her apartment door.

The charge of Organized Retail Theft has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Stanwood Case 2021-2916 Fraud

On 04-26-2021 the branch manager of a bank in Stanwood contacted the police to report fraud associated with 92-year-old woman's account. The bank staff reported concerns to Adult Protective Services after the victim made several large withdrawals from her account, followed by charges at FedEx and the United States Post Office.

The bank's investigation revealed the woman received notice she was a potential winner of the Publishers Clearing House sweepstakes. During the victim's subsequent contact with several unknown subjects by phone and e-mail, arrangements were made for her to pay fees via cashier's check and cash in excess of \$30,000.00.

The bank froze the victim's bank account to prevent further loss.
