Update Stanwood Case 2019-8179

Vehicle Prowl

On 10-17-19 Deputy Lafrance responded to the vehicle prowling complaint and learned the victim's purse was stolen from her car, after a subject smashed one of the car's windows. When the victim called her bank to report the theft of a credit card, she was advised the card had already been used at several locations in Stanwood and Arlington.

Detective Martin obtained video of the subject using the victim's credit card. The subject was identified after images from the video were posted on the Stanwood Police Department Facebook page.

On 11-13-19 the subject was booked into the Snohomish County Jail on charges related to a Mountlake Terrace Police case. One of the charges was theft of a firearm.

On 11-19-19 the Stanwood case was sent to the Prosecutor's Office for review.

On 02-03-2021 Detective Martin received notification from the Prosecutor's Office advising the charge of Identity Theft had been filed in Snohomish County Superior Court.

On 01-25-2021 and 01-30-2021 the male and female subjects pictured in the photos on the left stole several hundred dollars of clothing items from a local store. The male and female subject pictured in the photos on the right returned to the store on 02-15-2021 and attempted to steal clothing items but left the store empty handed after being confronted by an employee.

The female has been identified by staff at her apartment complex in Marysville. The male with scars on his head has been identified by his Community Corrections Officer.

Detective Martin will be attempting interviews with the subjects.



Stanwood Case 2021-981

Forgery/Identity Theft

On 02-24-2021 Deputy Chaney responded to a fraud complaint and learned the victim's debit card was used to gain access to funds associated with forged checks. The victim lost his debit card about a month ago.

The forged checks listed the victim as the payee and were deposited into the victim's account using his debit card. The suspect was able to withdraw a portion of the funds deposited into the victim's account, before the bank confirmed the fraudulent activity.

Detective Martin learned the checks were stolen during a vehicle prowl in Renton. Other items stolen during the vehicle prowl were tracked to a homeless camp in Renton.

Detective Martin will apply for a search warrant to get video from the bank ATM machines associated with the transactions.
