#### Stanwood Case 2021-3128 Burglary/Vehicle Theft

On 05-05-2021 Deputy Scott responded to a burglary complaint at the City of Stanwood Public Works building. Sometime between the evening of 05-04-2021 and early morning hours of 05-05-2021 numerous tools and a vehicle were stolen from the property. The vehicle was later recovered unoccupied on a wooded property in the area of 50 AV NW and 212 ST NW, Stanwood.

While investigating a series of commercial burglaries in Marysville, detectives from the North County Property Crimes Unit found a Facebook Marketplace post selling a Dewalt grease gun. The posted photo of the tool showed markings applied by a Stanwood Public Works employee.

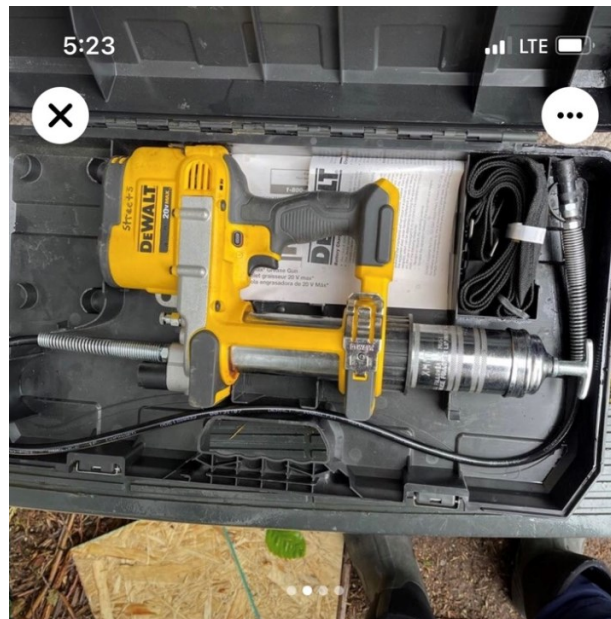
Detectives from the North County Property Crimes Unit contacted the subject associated with Facebook Marketplace post at an apartment complex in Arlington. The male was driving a vehicle filled with items covered by a tarp. Tools consistent with those stolen from the City of Stanwood could be seen under the tarp. The subject's vehicle was impounded for a search warrant.

The subject told detectives he was contacted by an unidentified person and told he would be paid a fee if he sold some tools. The subject described picking the tools up from a property near where the City of Stanwood truck was recovered.

Detective Martin assisted Detective Belleme and Detective Charboneau during the search warrant service on the subject's vehicle. Tools from several recent burglaries were recovered to include items stolen from the City of Stanwood Public Works building.

The recovered items were returned to their respective owners.

Charges of Possession of Stolen Property and Trafficking in Stolen Property are being referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

## Stanwood Case 2021-2916 Update Fraud

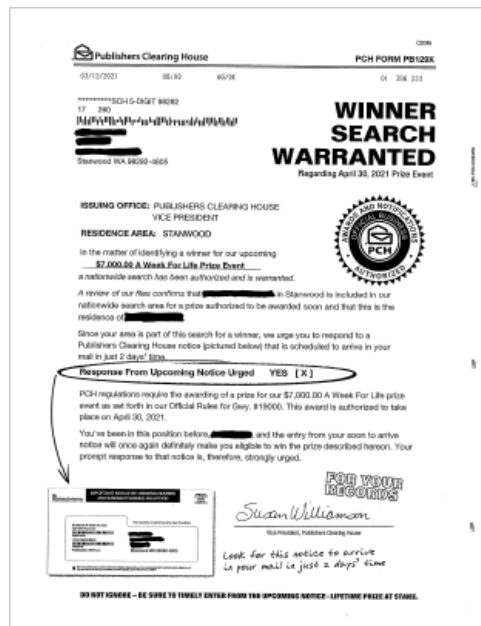

On 04-26-2021 the branch manager of a bank in Stanwood contacted the police to report fraud associated with 92-year-old woman's account. The bank staff reported concerns to Adult Protective Services after the victim made several large withdrawals from her account, followed by charges at FedEx and the United States Post Office.

The bank's investigation revealed the woman received notice she was a potential winner of the Publishers Clearing House sweepstakes. During the victim's subsequent contact with several unknown subjects by phone and e-mail, arrangements were made for her to pay fees via cashier's check and cash in excess of \$30,000.00.

The bank froze the victim's bank account to prevent further loss.

Detective Martin contacted subjects living in Las Vegas, Nevada and Hazlehurst, Mississippi, associated with the scam and determined they were likely victims of identity theft and unwitting participants in the transfer of funds to an unidentified third party in an unknown location.

## Stanwood Case 2018-5799 Update Forgery

On 10-08-2018 a woman used another person's identity when passing a forged check at a local grocery store. The woman was identified after area detectives reviewed store video. Charges of Identity Theft and Forgery were referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

The charges associated with the Stanwood case were merged with other law enforcement agency cases involving the same woman and similar crimes. The woman was granted the opportunity to participate in the Drug Offender Sentencing Alternative program.

The woman successfully completed the program within the last couple of months.
