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STANWOOD- City takes Coronavirus Precautions.

The City of Stanwood has been closely monitoring updates regarding Novel Coronavirus 2019. While we are NOT closing City Hall, or other facilities, we will be following Snohomish County protocol for meetings and public events by taking the following precautions:

- Field reservations for groups over 10 will be rescheduled
- The March 12, 2020 City Council Meeting has been canceled
- The March 12, 2020 Community Development Committee Meeting has been canceled
- The March 16, 2020 Parks and Trails Advisory Committee Meeting has been canceled
- The March 9th and March 23rd 2020 Planning Commission Meetings have both been canceled

Please note: There are no known cases in Stanwood, cancelation of these meetings allows us to monitor the situation. Meetings scheduled later in the month have NOT been canceled.

- The March 26, 2020 City Council Meeting has NOT been canceled
- The March 26, 2020 Finance/Personnel Committee Meeting has NOT been canceled
- The March 26, 2020 Public Safety Committee Meeting has NOT been canceled
- The March 27, 2020 Economic Development Board Meeting has NOT been canceled

City staff will continue to monitor the situation and implement a plan to ensure that City business continues to move forward. The most important thing you can do is remain calm, prepared, and informed. It also is important to take standard illness prevention steps. The same steps you take to reduce the spread of flu or other respiratory illnesses are key tools for reducing the spread of Coronavirus:

- Wash Hands Often with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds
- Keep hands away from mouth, nose or eyes to avoid transferring germs
- Clean and disinfect frequently used surfaces like counters, light switches, doorknobs, phones, and remotes
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw tissue away and wash your hands
- If you feel sick, stay home and avoid close contact with others
